Roger Rayle, 314 N. Wagner, stated he has been a citizen advocate watching over the Gelman dioxane plume for the last 26 years. He spoke about the direction of the spread of the plume in recent years.

9. Rod Casey - Marijuana Revenue

Rod Casey, Ypsilanti resident, spoke about the revenue the City is collecting from marijuana licensing. He urged the City to allocate some of the revenue collected for drug treatment and mental health treatment.

10. Kai Petainen - Pedestrian Railway Crossing

Kai Petainen, City resident, spoke about a pedestrian safety issue along the train bridge over the Huron River. He expressed concern about some recent tree trimming and how it has further endangered pedestrians who are using the train tracks for crossing.

COUNCILMEMBER GRISWOLD

Councilmember Griswold stated she would be hosting office hours in the Council Work Room on Sunday evenings before City Council meetings beginning March 3. If there is interest from Council, she may bring back Caucus meetings as well.

Councilmember Griswold thanked supporters of the A2SafeTransport for coming to tonight's meeting. She also thanked City Administrator Lazarus for his report and plans on this issue. She urged City staff to add a Crosswalk category to A2Fix It.

COUNCILMEMBER HAYNER

Councilmember Hayner stated the monthly CARD meeting would be held tomorrow at the County Service Center between 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. He noted that Governor Whitmer is reorganizing the MDEQ and stated he hopes that the environment will be prioritized under the new organization.

COUNCILMEMBER BANNISTER

Councilmember Bannister stated she would also be participating in office hours at City Hall on Sundays with Councilmember Griswold. She stated they would look into Caucus if there is interest later from more Councilmembers and/or the public.

Councilmember Bannister also announced other upcoming Ward 1 meetings and urged the public to attend. Issues such as Police Oversight and water quality would be discussed.

Councilmember Bannister announced that Northside STEAM School received a \$15,000 Sustaining Ann Arbor Together grant.

Councilmember Bannister spoke about the polar vortex and urged residents needing help to visit the Delonis Shelter or to call 911. She also reminded residents that the City provides free sand/salt mixtures for residents to take at various locations throughout the City.

Councilmember Grand thanked the more than 60 City residents who applied to be members of the newly created Independent Community Police Oversight Commission. A Ward One resident expressed concern about Council's transparency, questioning who is receiving text messages during public meetings. The resident also asked whether any Council Members were funding a "Go Fund Me" page that supported suing the City.

David Silkworth, Ward Five, spoke about water rates and questioned whether landlords are passing the new water rate reduction for multi-family users on to their tenants.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER RAMLAWI

Councilmember Ramlawi thanked Assistant City Attorney Arianne Slay for her work on the Trespass Ordinance.

Councilmember Ramlawi responded to a citizen comment that suggested certain councilmembers were not transparent or had not been vetted. He urged the citizen to request any information he wanted under the Freedom of Information Act.

COUNCILMEMBER GRISWOLD

Councilmember Griswold thanked Kai Petainen for providing photos, both good and bad examples, of crosswalks. She stated she is working with Representative Ronnie Peterson to introduce legislation on this issue at the State again.

COUNCILMEMBER HAYNER

Councilmember Hayner spoke about a missing piece of the border-to-border trail and stated he would be bringing this issue up during the budget cycle.

Councilmember Hayner addressed a public comment suggesting that he was influenced during Council meetings regarding his vote. He stated he doesn't even have a cellular phone on at meetings.
