Dear Commission,

I write you as the volunteer park steward of the South Pond Nature Preserve. As can be ascertained from the attached petition, which has 1120 signatures, a substantial proportion of Ann Arbor residents are opposed to the South Pond Village proposal that will be discussed at your upcoming Wednesday Jan 21st meeting. The petition calls to “Permanently preserve all of South Pond Wetlands drainage basin as a nature area and wildlife sanctuary.” The primary concern expressed in the petition is environmental, that the runoff from the proposed development will damage the wetlands and South Pond that lie immediately downstream from the proposed village. This concern is echoed by Barb Barton formerly This is an area of great natural beauty as can be seen from a website we have set up <http://southpondnature.org> I strongly urge the Commission to visit this website. It documents the environmental sensitivity and charm of the area that will be impacted by development in ways that are far more approachable than the official site plan does.

One key concern is the land including and adjacent to the wetlands impacted by development is the habitat of the Dukes’ Skipper butterfly, a species that is critically imperiled, State rank S1. This classification is reserved for only the very rarest species. According to Dave Borneman of NAP it is “*the only animal in that category known to be a resident in any of our parks*”. The complete description of this category is: S1 = critically imperiled in the state because of extreme rarity (5 or fewer occurrences or very few remaining individuals or acres) or because of some factor(s) making it especially vulnerable to extirpation in the state.

The only other SI animal, that Dave B. is aware of, that is a resident of the whole city of Ann Arbor is the peregrine falcon, which has been documented nesting at Burton tower on UM campus. As the park steward, I have personally observed peregrine falcons hunting in the existing South Pond Nature preserve. Thus by following the recommendations of the petition and preserving this area instead of developing it, one could have habitat for the only two critically imperiled animals that Ann Arbor has within the very same preserve!

Ann Arbor has the reputation of being a green town. If it becomes known that they allow developments to proceed without adequately assessing the impacts that they can have on our very rarest animals then this reputation will be damaged.

In the initial review of the project on 10/15/2014 first on the list of NAP's requests from the developer concerning natural features was "Please graphically delineate any endangered or threatened species habitat on the property on the Natural Features Impact summary sheets."

The developers have failed to do so. Instead they have limited themselves to providing a written description that simply parrots the generic published descriptions of the Dukes' skipper habitat. *Without the area of the skipper habitat clearly shown on the development plans there is no way that you can be certain that the development is not interfering with this habitat.* It is important to note that the habitat is not the wetlands themselves but the margins of wetlands, and it is generally found in *Carex lacustrus* stands within wooded areas. Two lots on E Huron River Drive that were preemptively cleared over the labor day weekend in Sept of 2014. As described in the Ann Arbor News, a great deal of concern was expressed by neighbors concerning this clearing, because of the environmental sensitivity of the are and because we were under the impression that a stop work order had been imposed on the site. The possibility that this preemptive clearing did indeed impact the skipper habitat was expressed in Sept 3rd 2014 email form Luke Golden of the Michigan DNR. "We have also received other calls and complaints. It appears as if they are not in any violation of the site

except for perhaps the endangered butterfly that supposedly was recorded out there before” (italics mine)

As shown in the attached letter of Aug 14th 2014 Lori Sargent the Endangered Species Specialist of the Michigan DNR clearly requested that the developer “respond to this office with a plan to either avoid harm to the species or evidence that the species is no longer present at the site”. According to my email correspondence with Lori they have failed to do so, instead only providing them with a generic assertion that intend to not harass, harm etc the Skipper. Without knowing exactly where the habitat is it is impossible for them to give this assurance. What is needed is an actual survey of Dukes skipper habitat and presence. This can only be adequately done during the flight season. I respectfully request that the project be delayed until these surveys are done.

As documented in the attached letter from Barb Barton the change in drainage pattern caused by the development is likely to disrupt the water supply to the wetland. Channeling all the current flow to a single point source is a bit like replacing a long network of soaker hoses that water a garden with a single open tap. Worse, the water for the wetland will no longer be spring fed but the effluent from chemically treated lawns. The proposed holding pond for this effluent is effective in removing sediment but much less effective in removing nutrients and dissolved contaminants like herbicides and pesticides which will likely alter these sensitive wetlands.

The water supply for the two houses on E Huron River Drive would almost certainly require a water main from the main portion of the development. These are not clearly shown on the site plan. This water main would need to cross the wetlands that separate the main portion of the proposed development from the isolated properties on E Huron River Drive, almost certainly triggering the need for state wetlands permits. This is contrary to the assurances given at the citizens participation meeting that the developers intend to avoid the need for a state wetlands permit.

The developers were requested to provide a revised version of their account of the citizens participation meeting after written complaints from citizens

that it painted an overly rosy picture. In a letter from Matt Kowalski to the developer (Planning Review #1 10-16-14) Matt stated: "Citizens have expressed concern that the required citizen participation does not accurately reflect all of the comments mentioned at the CPO meeting. Please review the meeting notes/minutes and add clarification"

Despite being provided with both a recording of the meeting and two professionally prepared transcripts, they have failed to do so. This type of behavior makes a mockery of the process. In any case, that the developers are allowed to provide a report of the statements made at the citizens participation meeting raises a clear conflict of interest. This is kind of like having the fox report on how happy the chickens in the coop are. I think that the policy of how the report of the citizens participation meetings is prepared needs to be reexamined by the city so that a more independent and accurate perspective can be obtained. Otherwise it is just a waste of everybody's time.

The background statement for the attached petition reads as follows:

"The wetlands adjacent to South Pond serve as one of the last remaining habitats of the critically imperiled Dukes' Skipper butterfly. These wetlands are threatened by a plan that would plow 75 McMansions, built by billionaire developer William Pulte, onto a newly deforested plateau adjacent to the wetlands.

The effluent from their massive, chemically treated lawns, would discharge into the wetlands only feet from where the Skipper has been sighted. This plan is currently being considered by Ann Arbor City officials. To help preserve the natural habitat, the City of Ann Arbor wisely suggested removing the lots off Huron River Drive. The developer ignored this request and has now proposed increasing the total number of lots. Ironically, the land is currently owned by Old National, a bank that trumpets its green credentials. If approved, the plan would fundamentally alter the scenic and environmental qualities that have made the South Pond area so unique and iconic.



Thank you for the recent correspondence regarding the proposed South Pond Village in Ann Arbor, Washtenaw County.

There is a known occurrence of a state-threatened insect, Duke's skipper (*Euphyes dukesi*), at the proposed project site. Please see enclosure for more information regarding this species.

Under Act 451 of 1994, the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, Part 365, Endangered Species Protection, "a person shall not harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, kill, trap, capture, collect, or attempt to engage in any such conduct or possess, transport, ... fish, plants, and wildlife indigenous to the state and determined to be endangered or threatened," unless first receiving an Endangered Species Permit from the Department of Natural Resources, Wildlife Division.

Please respond to this office with a plan to either avoid harm to the species or evidence that the species is no longer present at the site.

Thank you for your cooperation in addressing the protection of Michigan's natural heritage. Please contact me if you have any questions.

I am responding to your request for information on the Duke's skipper that was observed in July of 2005 in the *Carex lacustris* area at South Pond South Park. I was the Lepidopterist for the City of Ann Arbor, Natural Area Preservation (NAP) as well as an endangered species biologist for Michigan Natural Features Inventory during that time.


Duke's skipper is listed as a Threatened species in Michigan and is found in semi-shaded patches of *C. lacustris* that are surrounded by forest land. I have attached a species abstract that I wrote while an endangered species biologist with Michigan Natural Features for additional information. At South Pond South the species was found in such habitat.

Protection of wetlands where Duke's skippers live is only part of the effort need to ensure its survival. Surrounding uplands are needed as a buffer and trees provide shade critical to the butterfly. Upon reviewing the plans for the proposed development at South Pond South, there are several concerns I would like to point out:

- The plans show complete destruction of the area where Duke's is recorded from
- Even if the wetlands and slopes were preserved, there are additional issues which will likely negatively impact the butterfly...
- Removing the forest cover on the adjacent property and developing the site will increase runoff into the marsh, resulting in changes to the hydrology which will impact plant life
- Remove the canopy cover provided by the trees will make the *C. lacustris* patch unsuitable for Duke's skipper
- Increased sediment loading from the new impervious surfaces and added nutrient input from lawn fertilizers will increase eutrophication and cause changes in plant species composition in the wetland which will alter the butterfly's habitat

It is my professional opinion that development of the wooded site adjacent to the marsh is not recommended if any extant populations of Duke's skipper are to be preserved at South Pond South.

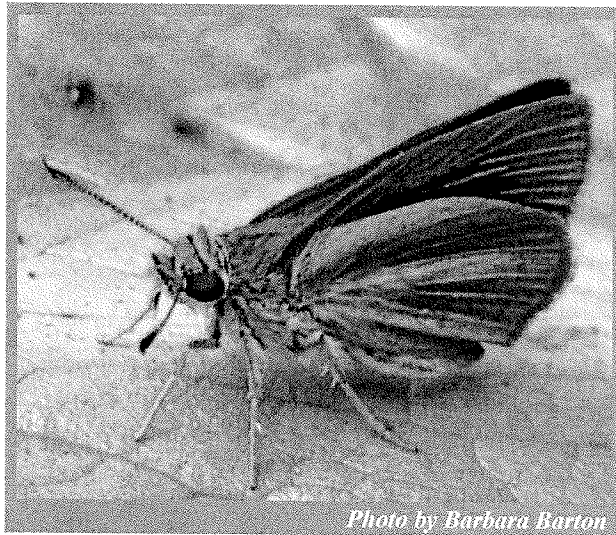
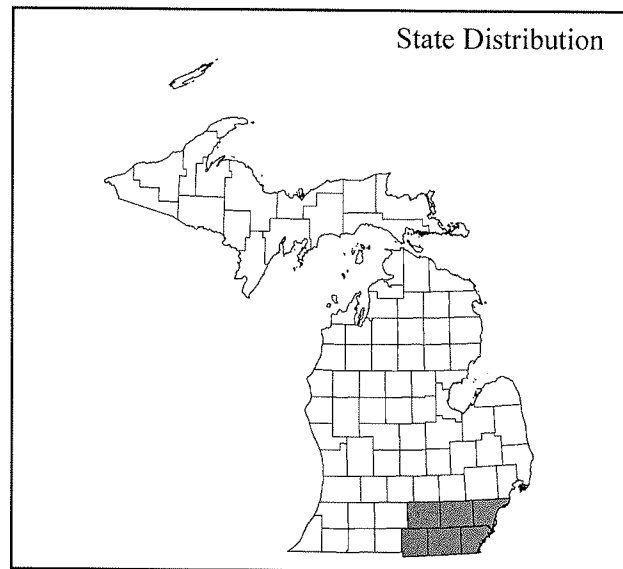
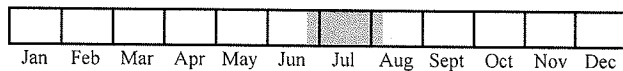

Status: State threatened

Global and State Rank: G3/S1

Family: Hesperidae (skippers)

Total Range: Dukes' skipper occurs in three regions of the eastern United States, 1) in southern Ontario, southeastern Michigan, northeastern Indiana and northern Ohio, 2) the lower Mississippi Valley from central Missouri and southern Illinois south to the Gulf Coast, and 3) along the Atlantic Coast from Southeast Virginia to southern Georgia (Opler and Krizek 1984). The sub-species *E. dukesi calhouni* occurs in peninsular Florida (Shuey 1996). Indiana populations are found in discrete areas of the northeast and southwest portions of the State (Shuey 2005). In Ohio, Dukes' skipper is primarily found in the northwestern part of the state in the Black Swamp area (Iftner et al. 1992).

State distribution: Dukes' skipper populations are currently known from seven locations in Jackson, Monroe, Wayne and Lenawee Counties. There are six historical records from Monroe County and one from Washtenaw County. It is unknown if populations still persist at these sites.

Recognition: Dukes' skippers range in size from 32-38 mm (1¼-1½ in) with females slightly larger than males.

The upper surfaces of the short, rounded wings are deep brown. Females have a hindwing band that has two to three pale yellow spots. Males have a black stigma on the forewing. The underside of the hindwings in both sexes are light brown with pale yellow rays (Opler and Krizek 1984, Scott 1986, Pyle 1995). Female Dion skippers (*Euphyes dion*) are similar, but Dukes' skipper females can be differentiated by their blunt forewing tips and darker ground color (Iftner et al. 1992). Larvae have a black head and light green body. The pupae nest in sedge leaves by attaching themselves with silk threads into the upper portion of the plants (Nielsen 1999).

Best survey time: The flight period begins in late June and ends in early August, with the peak flight period during July. Surveys should be conducted during mid-to late afternoon in shaded to partially shaded *Carex lacustris* stands. Surveyors should walk slowly through the habitat, stopping frequently to visually survey the habitat for skippers, which are often observed flying low through the sedges. Dukes' skippers can also be found at nectar sources within and adjacent to their habitat. Voucher specimens or good quality photos are needed to confirm identifications.

Habitat: Dukes' skipper favors *Carex lacustris* patches in shaded forested wetlands, roadside ditches and floodplain forests. Several tree and plant species are associated with Dukes' skipper habitat in Michigan;

swamp white oak (*Quercus palustris*), scarlet oak (*Q. coccinea*), swamp white oak (*Q. bicolor*), sugar maple (*Acer saccharinum*), buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*), swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*), and jewelweed (*Impatiens pallida*). Natural community associations include southern wet meadows, openings in southern swamps, inundated shrub swamps, and southern shrub-carr.

Biology: The flight periods for Dukes' skipper are regionally dependent. In Ohio, southern Ontario, south-east Michigan, and northern Indiana, Dukes' skippers have one brood that flies during late June through early August. Dukes' skippers have two-three flights from mid-May through October in the mid- and southern portions of their range.

Eggs are laid under the leaves of their host plants, sedges in the genus *Carex*. After hatching, the larvae undergo several molts and diapause in the fourth instar stage. (Opler and Krizek 1984, Iftner et al. 1992, Pyle 1995, Glassberg 1999, Nielsen 1999).

Dukes' skipper larvae feed on *Carex lacustris* in the northern parts of their range and *C. hyalinolepis* in the south (Opler and Krizek 1984, Iftner et al. 1992). Preferred nectar sources include buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*), swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*), common milkweed (*A. syriaca*), and joe-pye-weed (*Eupatorium purpureum*). This species has an affinity for shaded, *Carex* patches in wet woods, and can also be found visiting nectar sources in adjacent open areas.

Conservation/management: Dukes' skipper is listed as a threatened species by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, with only seven extant populations known in Michigan. Protection of existing sites is critical. Habitat fragmentation and alteration, pesticide spraying, and invasive species are serious threats to this species. Changes in hydrology can alter the habitat by shifting the plant species composition, and thus should be avoided at known sites. Invasive species such as glossy buckthorn (*Rhamnus cathartica*), purple loosestrife (*Lythrum salicaria*), and common reed (*Phragmites australis*) should be removed since they can displace the native vegetation. Spraying of pesticides for gypsy moths or agricultural pests near known sites is discouraged.

Research needs: A status survey for Dukes' skipper

and an analysis of their population dynamics would be valuable to assess the viability of known populations and identify significant metapopulations. Additionally, more life history studies are needed to identify larval hostplants and adult dispersal capabilities.
