NEW BUSINESS

1. Staff Update

Peg Kohring spoke to the commission regarding their Strategic Planning Workshop held earlier this year and five major themes were suggested.

Theme One - Talk to banks about properties that they may have recently acquired. Commissioner Berriz and Rubin were willing to make contact with banks to schedule future meetings. Tom Crawford also know some of the banks and is also willing to facilitate meetings. Geographical Information System staff is also working with Ms. Kohring to overlap where delinquent tax properties are within the greenbelt and will talk with banks about those properties as well.

Theme Two - Map of the expanded greenbelt area.

The map depicts where complexes are located. She said she would email copies of to the commission if desired.

Theme Three - Value and how we offer value on greenbelt properties. Staff talked with the City Attorney's Office. The assistant city attorney said that the current commission's process that is in place is a good operating process and had no problems with it. If farm and ranch land is involved, the land owner would be apprised of the fair market value, but the commission could offer less than fair market value for the property.

Theme four - The subcommittee for communication with City Council.

The sub committees have not met, but will meet directly after the Greenbelt Meeting this evening.

Theme five - Finances and Alternative Funding Options.

City Finance staff have provided a list of possibilities city attorney has been in the process of reviewing. As soon as the list is complete, a meeting will be held to discuss it.
