Activist and singer/songwriter Jeanne Mackey marks her 60th birthday with a disarmingly honest and wryly funny musical chronicle of her search for personal and ancestral healing, from the high desert of the Eastern Sierras to the verdant Irish countryside.

Mackey explores the meaning of magic, homeland, curses, and death in a memoir-in-song that draws on her deeply

personal experiences of transformative change in an era that taught Americans to celebrate their differences.

“Jeanne weaves the story of her spiritual seeking and emotional healing in such an entertaining, humorous way that my heart was opened,” says local activist Molly Reno.

The show’s title comes from 14th century Persian mystic Hafiz. According to legend, Hafiz was asked, “What is the sign of someone who knows God?” He replied, “Dear, they have dropped the knife. They have dropped the cruel knife most so often use upon their tender self and others.” (*Daniel Ladinsky, The Subject Tonight is Love*)

Mackey is joined by musicians Laszlo Slomovits (guitar, mandolin, fiddle, pennywhistle, pan pipes), Lori Fithian (percussion), Eric Fithian (bass), with Mary Wilson and Dale Petty on back-up vocals. Stacie Chaiken, of the Los Angeles-based studio What’s the Story, has served as dramaturg and guide.

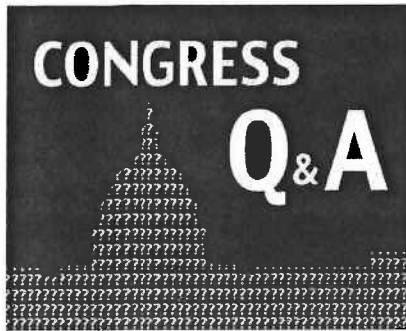

The gay-rights movement literally began to split at a March 18 rally.

Dan Choi, an Army lieutenant since discharged under the military's Don't Ask Don't Tell policy, stood before a group of hundreds of activists with the Human Rights Campaign at a gathering that day in Washington's Freedom Plaza, a popular protest venue.

"Our fight is at the White House," Choi told the crowd, "and I am asking you to send a message to the president with me, to my commander in chief."

Choi then left the rally for Pennsylvania Avenue, where he chained himself to the fence in front of the White House in his camouflage uniform.

But the leadership of the Human Rights Campaign—the nation's largest gay-rights group—did not follow Choi that day.

Liberal Rally Focuses on Upcoming Elections



Liberal activists representing a host of causes gathered near the Capitol Saturday, but they directed their message at the voters back home.

"We've got to get voters off of the sidelines and back on the battlefield," Benjamin Todd Jealous, president of the NAACP, said at the One Nation Working Together rally.

The all-encompassing event was organized by 300 liberal groups and labor unions.

Thousands of people lined up along the Lincoln Memorial Reflecting Pool with signs that addressed many issues on the liberal agenda: "Health care not warfare," "Bring our troops and war dollars home now," "Education cuts never heal," and "A jobless recovery is not a recovery."
