NORTH BURNS PARK AREA ASSOCIATION NO PARKING TUESDAY PROGRAM

Residents in the North Burns Park Area Association who reside on a side of a street signed as "No Parking Tuesday 8:00am – 6:00pm" will be able to request a waiver of street parking enforcement on specific Tuesdays for special circumstances, including but not limited to temporary handicap parking needs and outside contractor/maintenance activities scheduled on their property. Residents who contact the City (994-1760) in advance and provide specific information concerning the special circumstance (including reasonable vehicle identification) will be granted a one-day waiver of parking restrictions. Residents who provide a written request to the City Administrator, or his designee, and provide information concerning hardship, along with reasonable vehicle identification, will be considered for exemption from the "No Parking Tuesday" restriction.
