Thomas Partridge, 4220 Eyrie Dr., asked that Council plan for an equality transportation system with links to walking, biking, train and other forms of motorized transportation.

# 2. Kathy Griswold - Non-Motorized Transportation (DS-7)

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt, expressed concern with the City's maintenance of the proposed Non-Motorized Transportation path on Washtenaw Avenue. She said that there is escalating recurring costs in maintaining the sidewalks and it created an inequity to homeowners and it created an expectation that the City is going to maintain any new sidewalk.

# 3. Kim Kachadoorian - My Dying Tree

Kim Kachadoorian, 204 E. Davis, addressed Council regarding a dying tree in front of her property. She said that the tree is rotting from the inside out. She has called the City, At&T and Detroit Edison and everyone has said that they cannot help until one of the other groups addresses the problem from their side first.

Ms. Kachadoorian said that neither her neighborhood, nor surround neighborhoods (Germantown), were notified of the robbery that took place over the weekend. She said that their neighborhoods should have received a red alert about the robbery. They only knew of the robbery because of a U of M red alert.

#### COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin talked about the rainstorm that took place on August 11, 2010. He said that the Allen Creek Watershed has not been adequately monitored and that a hydrological study is needed in the area where the storm took place. Councilmember Anglin stated more conclusive data is needed to study this problem.

#### COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

## AUGUST 11, 2010 RAINSTORM

City Administrator Roger Fraser gave an update on the rainstorm that took place on August 11, 2010. He said that parts of the City received over an inch of rain in 45 minutes. During the storm, the Mallett's Creek went from approximately 3.5 cubic feet per second to approximately 380 cubic feet per second. The issues reported were consistent with what you would expect from a short and intense storm; stormwater ponding, flooding, and overflow in the streets. There was one area with reported sanitary sewer backup on Parkwood and Oakwood and was similar to the June 11 storm event. That is cause for an investigation and effected property owners would receive letters requesting access to their homes so that the City can look at the sewer and connection service.

The stormwater system surcharge overloaded in a number of areas such as Chapin, Huron and the Railroad Trussell, Depot Street, Thurston and Kingsley. The rainstorm that occurred on Wednesday was between a one hundred and two hundred year event, so the flooding was consistent with system expectations.

Mr. Fraser said that staff would share hydrologic information already accumulated regarding Allen Creek with Council.

#### WATERMAIN BREAK

There was a watermain break at Plymouth Road near the Wendy's Restaurant. The break damaged some of the street pavement which must be repaired before winter. Street pavement repairs may also be included in the project which was scheduled to start in September.

#### PLYMOUTH ROAD STREET RECONSTRUCTION

Stage Two of the reconstruction on Plymouth Road began last Thursday with a traffic shift from the two northern lanes of Plymouth Road to the southerly lanes. The project is expected to be completed by mid-September.

# MILLER ROAD STREET RESURFACING

Work will begin on Miller Road August 23, 2010. Westbound traffic on Miller will be shut down and rerouted. Construction is expected to continue through November.

#### WEST STADIUM BLVD CONSTRUCTION

Traffic on Stadium Boulevard was switched to the southside of the road in order to begin construction on the northside. The northside of the road is expected to be finished quicker than the southside because there is less underground work required. The entire project is expected to be completed by November.

#### SYLVAN AVENUE STREET RESURFACING

This is the City's first street construction with permeable porous paving material. It will require additional maintenance with on-going sweeping, but staff believes this project will be an enhancement for the environment. The project is expected to only take a week to complete.

#### NORTH STATE STREET - HURON TO KINGSLEY

The first layer of asphalt was placed on Friday, August 13, 2010 and the final paving is scheduled for Wednesday, August 18, 2010. The street will be completely closed on the final paving day. Multiple flaggers will be on site to direct traffic in the area.

# RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Recycling Rewards Program starts September 1 for single-family and duplex residents. The program offers rewards and points to residents for using their recycling carts. Residents earn points based upon how much they recycle. Rewards can be used at many local and national vendors and include an option to get free admission to the City drop-off station, which is normally \$3. Eligible participants were mailed information about how to sign up for the program last week. The City is also working with Recycle Bank to develop a new innovative approach to allow apartment complexes and businesses to participate at a later date. # 2010 GOVERNMENTAL AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN URBAN FORESTRY FROM MDNR

The city received the Governmental Award for Excellence in Urban Forestry from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR). The award is given annually for significant advances in forestry over the past year.

#### HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION

The Historic District Commission approved an application for a solar electric installation at the Michigan Theater. This is the first project of the XC Energy Community Supported Solar Program developed as a part of the City's Solar America City Grant and administered by the Clean Air Coalition. Installation is planned for this fall.

# PUBLIC OPEN-HOUSE CELEBRATION

There will be a public open-house celebration at the Materials Recovery Facility located at 4150 Platt Road on August 21, 2010 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The facility has been upgraded to a state-of-the-art single stream recycling plant capable of processing 15-20 tons of recyclables an hour, over two shifts per day. Ribbon cutting ceremony starts at 11 a.m. on Saturday.

# POLICE/COURT BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

Work continues on the construction of the new building and the remodeling of the Larcom Building. Ceiling and floor tiles are in place. Work is ongoing on the second floor. Elevator inspections are under way. Masonry and drywall are completed in the basement of the Larcom building, exterior skin and framing and sheeting and vapor barrier for the elevator tower have been completed. Work has also begun on the removal/repair of the east wall in the Police/Garage area of the Larcom building.
