Last December I submitted the enclosed letter to the Planning Committee for consideration in its deliberations regarding this proposal. Since the last public hearing on December 15, 2009, which addressed this proposal, the noise nuisance associated with the barking and howling in the outside play area of the Arbor Dog Daycare site has continued unabated. Being age-bound to my condominium residence, this noise nuisance continues to affect my quality of life.

Because I will not be able to attend the public hearing being held on September 21, 2010, with this letter I wish again to implore the Planning Committee to maintain the maximum number of dogs that Arbor Dog Daycare can accommodate at its site at 2856 S. Main Street at the current level set under the existing agreement and not to allow an extension to a maximum of 125 dogs as proposed under the aforementioned special exemption use proposal.

Thank you for your thoughtful consideration of my concerns in your evaluation and deliberations regarding this proposal.

I AM AN 80 YEAR OLD BALMORAL PARK RESIDENT WHOSE RESIDENCE IS IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO OAKBROOK DRIVE AND DIRECTLY ACROSS FROM THE CURRENT ANN ARBOR DOG DAYCARE FACILITY.

PRESENTLY AT THIS FACILITY, DOGS BARK AND HOWL VERY LOUDLY FOR AN EXTENDED TIME, ALMOST WITHOUT INTERRUPTING, THROUGHOUT THE DAY. THIS NOISE NUISANCE IS EXTREMELY DISCONCERTING AND ANNOYING, AND IT WILL ONLY INCREASE UNDER THE PROPOSED EXCEPTION TO ALLOW A MAXIMUM OF 125 DOGS ON SITE. THIS BARKING AND HOWLING DESTROY THE TRANQUILITY THAT SHOULD BE A PREROGATIVE OF ANY OWNER OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR.
