



Identify Project Needs and Scopes






Prioritize Needs based on Strategic Value

- Define organization/community priorities
- Define objectives to achieve priorities
- Evaluate "strategic value":
 - How well does the project achieve community goals?
 - How does expected value of one project compare to another?





CIP Process





- Determine how to best incorporate equity and sustainability in the scoring process
 - Office of Organizational Equity established September 2022
 - A²ZERO plan adopted June 2020
 - Expanded Office of Sustainability and Innovations
- Review/update all existing scoring criteria
 - 6 asset groups updated during the 2020 Allovance adoption (★)
 - 8 asset groups using historic scoring criteria
- Re-score existing projects using new criteria





Scoring Criteria: Equity

- Existing criteria across different asset groups:
 - Percentage of households in poverty within project location
 - Ability to improve accessibility (ADA access, limited/full universal access)
- Update discussion to date:
 - Washtenaw County Opportunity Index
 - Vision Zero Transportation Equity Needs Map
 - Ability to resolve inequity gaps
 - Housing supply and desirability to live in Ann Arbor
 - Accessibility



Scoring Criteria: Sustainability

- Existing criteria across different asset groups:
 - Meets Sustainability Framework goals
 - Meets A² ZERO goals
 - Protects natural systems
 - Expands transportation options through active transportation and transit
 - Reduces energy load
 - Adds new trees
 - Reduces flooding
- Update discussion to date:
 - Focus on A² ZERO




