

Report on window sash at 537 Detroit Street Ann Arbor MI Prudence Spink, owner Conducted April 22 2011

The purpose of this site inspection was to determine the age or period of construction of the four wood sashes in the two one-over-one windows in the upper front bedroom of 537 Detroit Street, Ann Arbor, MI.

I carefully examined the four wood window sashes, sash channels, jamb, parting strip, inside casings, and inside stop. The lower sashes were operable, with sash ropes and pulleys in place. The upper sashes were painted shut. Sash locks are not original.

Without documentary evidence it is not possible to obtain a precise date of construction or installation. By close observation of physical details it is possible to estimate approximately when the sash were produced and placed in service.

The one over one configuration of window sash was popular beginning in the first quarter of the 20th Century. The molded profile of the window casing with simple turned bulls-eye corner blocks, molded profile of the sash stiles, rails and inside stop were popular in the late 19th and early 20th Century. Paint color layering and buildup indicate that these elements were placed in service at approximately the same time. The detail joinery and fastening (open dove tails and metal pin fasteners) of the window sash corners is of a type and method used from about the 1890's through the 1940's. The cast iron sash weight pulleys were in popular usage through the 1920's. Although not visually observed, cast iron sash weights were used exclusively in the late 19th and early 20th century residential construction.

After careful consideration of the physical evidence listed above and placing it in the context of historical time, I believe these window sash were produced and placed in use in this house between 1900 and 1930.
