It is my understanding that the University of Michigan has filed with the City Planning Commission, requesting approval for a permanent vacation of the one block of Monroe St. between South State St. and Oakland Ave.

Enclosed please find petitions in opposition to said closure.

I have gathered more than seven hundred names (aprox.735) on these petitions since March, 2011 in addition to 1,746 I already submitted to Planning Commission on 12/18/10.

It would be nice if all these people could be included on a list of who will be notified if and when there is to be a public hearing scheduled regarding this matter.

The closure of this portion of Monroe St. would deny vehicles an alternate route when traffic is too heavy on S. State St. This would also worsen the already existing problems at the corner of Hill St. and Oakland Ave. as well as at the intersection of Hill St. and Tappan St. Presently, it is frequently very difficult and time consuming to make a left turn onto, or cross over Hill St. from either Tappan or Oakland. This situation would only worsen. The proposed pedestrian mall will not be an improvement for the community at large.

A well marked pedestrian cross walk, like the one on N.Univ. near by the U.M. bus stops and Natural History Museum would work just fine. A pedestrian controlled traffic light is also another good option.

The proposed vacation of said portion of Monroe St. is neither necessary nor practical.
