#### STREET CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Geddes and Broadway Streets resurfacing projects are completed and the streets are open to traffic. The West Stadium Boulevard Project is nearing completion on the south half of the road and in the coming weeks, they will switch traffic over and begin construction on the north side. The project is on schedule for final completion in November 2010.

Geddes Road, US-23 at Earhart Improvement Project is ongoing. The easterly round-a-bout at the northbound US-23 ramp at Geddes is almost complete. The new non-motorized bridge spanning US-23 is nearly complete with railings and fencing yet to be installed. The remaining project stages include completing two more round-a-bouts at the southbound ramps.

The Plymouth Road Street Resurfacing Project is financed by the Federal Stimulus Dollars. Construction continues on the southside of Plymouth Road between Nixon and US-23. Contractors have completed removing and replacing the curb and gutter and removing the old asphalt.

New projects include Miller Ave. from Main to Chapin. Resurfacing begins August 16, 2010 and one-way traffic would be maintained eastbound/inbound. Outbound/westbound traffic would be detoured.

Mr. Fraser said the City received an email from the US Department of Transportation regarding the East Stadium Bridges. The US DOT had received the City's pre-application for the Tiger 2 Discretionary Grant program and suggested that the City go ahead and submit the final grant application by August 23, 2010.

The Geddes Avenue Sanitary Sewer Project neighborhood meeting is scheduled for Wednesday August 11, 2010 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Senior Center.
