#### East Medical Center Drive Bridge Project

When staff brought forward a resolution (9/20/21) to award a design contract to DLZ for the East Medical Center Drive Rehabilitation and Widening Project, City Council directed (10/18/21) that the 'final design will utilize the additional width and capacity to facilitate and encourage multi-modal travel' and that the contract be amended 'to design the east-west pathway connection under the East Medical Center Drive Bridge and develop a cost estimate for construction.' The Commission first reviewed concepts at their November 2021 meeting. The Commission's packet includes a revised conceptual cross-sections of the widened bridge and how it is intended to accommodate multi-modal travel. Staff will seek feedback on this design concept.

#### 2022 Work Plan

A draft 2022 Transportation Commission Work Plan is included in the packet and presented to the Transportation Commission for review and comment. The work plan can be adapted throughout the year; no action is required at this meeting.



## Vision Zero Implementation Plan Steering Committee

City Council awarded a contract to Sam Schwartz, LLC to develop a Vision Zero Transportation Plan Implementation Strategy, Major Streets Traffic Calming program, and pedestrian safety communications at its October 18, 2021, meeting. Those materials can be found here:

The project kicked-off in November and staff is asking for a representative from the Transportation Commission to sit on the steering committee for this effort.

## American Rescue Program

The City is the recipient of \$24.2 million in federal COVID relief funds through the program known as "American Rescue Plan" (ARP). Included in the December 2021 Transportation Commission packet is a <u>memo shared with City Council about the proposed use of ARP funds</u>. Among the proposals are two transportation projects: Miller-Catherine Bike Facility (\$4M); and Vision Zero Plan Implementation (\$9.5M). Staff will review the transportation proposals and answer Commissioner questions.

# **Transportation Commission Annual Report 2021**

As has been the recent practice of the Transportation Commission, an annual progress report of the Transportation Commission's work over the course of the previous year is developed. Included in the packet is the draft report for calendar year 2021. The Commission is encouraged to review the document and provide suggestions on changes before it is finalized. The document will be finalized and shared with the Commission sometime after the new year.

# **Automated Enforcement Discussion**

On several occasions, the Transportation Commission has brought up the issue of automated enforcement, particularly for speed enforcement and red-light running and their impacts on safety.
