Fwd: Strive at Work - minutes-October 20th meeting

- -STRIVE at work program- Rick Reid has arranged a tour at Zingerman's BakeHouse- November 9th
- -Anne Glendon noted this tour is appropriate because Zingerman's tends to hire non-traditional employees, with materials for employees training and education.
- -Rick Reid has also arranged a tour of City Hall for the Spring- offer multiple job opportunities.
- -It was suggested that rides may have be to be organized and coordinated with Stone school and mentors for these visits.
- -It was asked: If the students are interested in working- how do they start or how do they follow up if given the opportunity?
- -Are there work study programs available?
- -How can the Subway lunches have more of an impact on students? To have students more engaged.
- -brainstorm with Stone School on this, suggestions being: create a to-do list for job preparation, how to present themselves, job skill interviews (students respond well to role play),

transition from high school to college (note taking, responsibility)

-explore different career as well as opportunities in different fields from what WCC has to offer, note the value of certificate programs, as opposed to

a degree

- When coordinating with WCC- be focused and goal specific- help students define this,
- -Ask Stone school about steps with partners to see how to achieve their goals a year from now. Both should know what the path is and what requirements are needed,
- -Budgeting skills should be a part of this- do they have an apartment, car, live at home etc. .
- -Coordinate with student a logical model based on individual- should have short term, mid-term and long term goals,
- -Model should address adaptability- stress to students to be adaptive to everyday stresses, to use their inner strength to adapt, and what they should do today to make that happen.

It was suggested to bring the students together periodically - an informal support group. It was asked how should this be facilitated? In this group adaptability could be discussed. What type of skill sets and how they translate over time? Look to the job that they may have today, help them to see how their current work skills, could be applied to future employment.

Anne Glendon- noted that Corner Health Centre is a good resource for the students and their families. It takes Medicare, helping mother, father and children up to age 21.

They are capable of providing whole body whole body and mind care. An excellent resource and good alternative to WCC and Stone School. Opportunity to discuss benefits of Corner Health Center at Subway lunches.

Concerning scholarships:

After the first year, commitment to the mentee is left up to their individual mentor.

After the first year, traditionally WCC will file the extension for funds. They have to use the money or lose it.

12 of 14 students from last year have filed the extension. This shows that a great amount of the money has been used.

Mentee- is awarded a Baker scholarship- from Washtenaw Community Foundation. Baker allows to apply for additional funds beyond what is awarded (as long as the recipient is a non-smoker)

-OR from Rotary scholarship through STRIVE- Rotary does not offer additional funds beyond what is awarded.

November meeting will be STRIVE at WORK- Zingerman's BakeHouse tour. No meeting on November 17th.

January meeting- it was suggested that this be a session for training the mentors. The mentors may make a request for a mentee after our Subway lunch Andy Dahlamn tries to match the mentor with the mentee. Currently 36 applicants that are eligibly enrolled at Stone School. It is the choice of Stone School.

The mentee must meet the criteria of drug free, alcohol free, attend class, academically acceptable.

Re: Paul's comments, the Census and American Community Survey count only commutes to work (in April), so they substantially under-count total bicycling for transportation.

Certainly, folks who bike need to know the rules of the road and observe safe biking practices. That said, I continue to believe (with the study's authors) that safe infrastructure is the most critical piece of the puzzle. As observed in the discussion, safety comes in numbers, and the way to accomplish that is to make biking comfortable for everyone.

As long as we need to wear reflective clothing to be assured of our safety, bicycling will not be a primary transportation mode for the majority of the population. For the time being, I'll still wear reflective clothing at night, but I look forward to a time when that's no longer needed.

Lights are another story; the amount of biking without lights in A2 is pretty distressing. City, U-M may need to launch a campaign on the subject.

Christy Perros AAPSEF Board Meeting Reminder and I4E Committee Notes

Hi all ~

This is a reminder that we have a board meeting this Thursday, November 18 from 4:00 - 5:00 pm at Dykema.

One of the agenda items is a vote on an Initiatives for Excellence grant recommendation; the committee is recommending that AAPSEF provide \$108,400 in funding for the Elementary World Language program this year. As you know from past reports the committee had many questions about this grant and the District has provided the answers, see below:

- 1. More detailed description of funding provided by both AAPS and UM for program? The District provided a detailed budget that showed expenses, including donated staff time, for UM and AAPS.
- 2. What is the District's plan for rolling program up to 5th grade in 2011? The District is committed rolling this program up to 5th grade in 2011; in a worst case scenario where there wasn't funding to have the program in 3 grades, they would roll up to 4th and 5th grade so that students who had already started in the program would not have an interruption in their language learning.
- 3. What is the District's plan for articulation to middle school so that students would have the opportunity for continuous world language study? The District is committed to providing instructional alignment for world language between elementary and middle schools. The current world language department chair is working in cooperation with UM to make this happen in 2012.
- 4. Is there an evaluation component? UM School of Education is responsible for the program evaluation component and they will share their data with AAPSEF.
- 5. How many students are impacted? There are 110 3rd and 4th grade classrooms and the program impacts 2,472 students.

Based on these answers the I4E committee has decided to recommend the \$108,400 in funding which will cover the District's contribution to UM for the program as well as materials and supplies for the program. If approved, our funding letter will contain language that stipulates program must roll up to 5th grade next year, that AAPSEF will have access to all program evaluation done by UM, and that the AAPSEF funding is to be used pay the District's partnership contribution and for materials/supplies.

If you have any questions please let me know. We will discuss this on Thursday before voting.

Ann Arbor City Council has been presented with a plan to out source the hugely successful compost operations to a Bio Solids (poop-sludge) operator from New York. It will give away the \$5,000,000 operations to a private firm to operate who will then CHARGE the city to drop off compostables there. This fee will have the affect of killing the fledgling food waste composting program as well the whole concept composting.

Any material composted saves 25-50% over the cost of land filling, therefore saving enormous amounts of money. It completes the recycling loop <u>locally</u> by taking trash and turning it into a cash product-compost, rather than hauling it huge distances to landfill it and create methane gas.

Please tell council to keep composting in house and expand it. Council is looking at approving a contract to BioSolids operator WeCare, **tonight**, Nov 15, 2010

Per your request, I wanted to share our thoughts on what we see as an actionable timeframe for this project from the point we are at now. As a backdrop, and assuming that the City was prepared to proceed on the basis of our recommendation, I thought referring to Valiant's own proposed timeline was a good starting point. They envisioned a roughly 18 month period from selection to finalization of all aspects of the deal and its financing. Concurrent with that 18 month financing period they would be proceeding with design and other necessary predevelopment activities such that a project could commence construction within a month or two of closing on all financing and the transaction as a whole. While this timeline might ultimately move around through our negotiation with them, it's a good place to start for discussion purposes. Assuming that window, I could envision the following cadence of activities from today:

- Finalization of recommendation and selection by Evaluation Committee Month 1
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 Month 6
- Completion of Entitlement Process

Month 12

• Completion of financing and other necessary transaction documents

Month 18

Commencement of Construction

Month 20

This is obviously highly simplified. For instance, we recognize that a deal of this complexity would actually involve myriad negotiated agreements not specified on this timeline. The schedule assumes that those agreements would be fully enumerated in the Development Agreement, and hammered out in the period between execution of that document and the completion of the transaction (i.e. between months 6 and 18). A schedule such as this, would actually permit entitlement to slip quite a bit and still keep on

track with financing. Obviously, the extent and length of the entitlement process is a bit of an unknown to us at this point. As for financing, my sense is that this team could actually move more swiftly than 18 months provided that we had nailed down the particulars of our deal to a sufficient degree.

Appreciate your input, and in particular the specific work plan elements surrounding the various Council approvals and entitlement process.

Whereas, on August 5, 2010, in Resolution #10-286, City Council imposed a temporary moratorium on the initiation or expansion of the use of property and structures in the City for dispensing and cultivating marihuana for a period of 120 days in conjunction with the study and revision of the City's Zoning Ordinance or other ordinances regarding this issue;

Whereas, the temporary moratorium was imposed for the reasons stated in the Resolution; and

Whereas, The City Council would like additional time to consider the draft revisions to the City's Zoning Ordinance, to consider a licensing ordinance for marihuana businesses, and to receive additional public comment regarding these ordinances;



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Resolution to Extend the Temporary Moratorium on the Use of Property and Structures in the City for Dispensing and Cultivating Marihuana

Whereas, on August 5, 2010, in Resolution #10-286, City Council imposed a temporary moratorium on the initiation or expansion of the use of property and structures in the City for dispensing and cultivating marihuana for a period of 120 days in conjunction with the study and revision of the City's Zoning Ordinance or other ordinances regarding this issue;

Whereas, the temporary moratorium was imposed for the reasons stated in the Resolution; and

Whereas, The City Council would like additional time to consider the draft revisions to the City's Zoning Ordinance, to consider a licensing ordinance for marihuana businesses, and to receive additional public comment regarding these ordinances;

RESOLVED, That City Council extend the temporary moratorium for 60 days from the original expiration date of December 3,2010 to January 31, 2011; and

RESOLVED, That the moratorium imposed by this resolution shall expire the earlier of January 31, 2011, or upon the effective date of ordinance amendments approved by City Council regarding the use of property or structures in the City for dispensing marihuana and/or cultivating marihuana plants for medical or any other purposes.



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
