At a SSA (Soaring Society of America http://www.ssa.org) I heard astronaut Bill Anders, talk about his Apollo 8 mission. Apollo 8 was the first trip to leave the Earth's orbit around the moon and then back. As he flew around the Moon he viewed the Earth and noticed how thin the atmosphere was. He compared the earth's gaseous envelope to the thickness of the skin on an Apple, cut open and viewed from the side, which is very thin. Most pilots and mountain climbers know that only 3 miles up the density of the sky is only 1/2 as it is at the surface. Having experienced this perspective gave Bill a very strong desire to make us, in the audience, understand the very limited capacity for our atmosphere to absorb the vast quantities of the man made material we inject into it.







Channelized Flow Rate Estimate














Connected Footing Drain Disconnection
