Thank you, Erica, but I am well informed about the housing crisis and of course read those articles. You did not address what I explicitly said was the more important issue. *Her appointment will make it substantially harder to fundraise*. This is not about her "personal views" or "opinions on a blog"; if she sits on the DDA board, she's not just a "resident" or private citizen. It is about a member of the DDA's policy positions and public statements, and what the mayor and council convey by using their appointment power to instantiate that position within the DDA.

I don't want to speak for others, but you should ask those trying to raise funds for the Center of the City, like Del Dunbar and Frank Wilhelme, highly experienced fundraisers and donors, to see what they think. If you support her appointment, the next time you (or anyone on social media) complains about the "skillset" of those supporting the Center of the City, Ann Arborites will rightly remind them of this decision, which does nothing but make fundraising more difficult. Why should anyone give to a cause the mayor and DDA seek to overturn? The city claims it wants the Center of the City to be a public-private partnership. Partners don't actively advocate for overturning what they are ostensibly partnering on. This is the central issue, to which over 2/3 of my letter was devoted, and it is to this I would appreciate your response. I believe what I am saying is actually quite non-controversial and self-evident.

I am writing to register my strong opposition to the reappointment of Jess Letaw to the DDA. While she may have served acceptably until now, her recent public manifesto, published on social media and in the <u>Damn Arbor</u> blog, makes this reappointment extremely inappropriate.

Her manifesto raises two troubling issues. First, she advocates against citizen voice in the planning process (something the DDA already diminishes). She quotes favorably two articles, "Community Input is Bad, Actually," and "Not Everyone Should Have a Say." While discussing this topic is valid, and she is careful with her words, DDA members should unequivocally support the concept of community input.

Second, and more importantly, she proclaims she is "strongly in favor of repealing Prop A" and thinks "City Council should (put) this on the ballot." She calls the Center of the City an "unmitigated disaster," "preposterous," and "ludicrous." It is the DDA's statutory responsibility to halt deterioration downtown and increase property values and tax revenue, objectives it has often pursued through investment in downtown parks. It is inappropriate for a DDA member to single out a specific park to be removed, especially one residents elected to place in our city charter (echoing her denigration of public input). And, crucially, if the Center of the City is to ever be a success as a public-private partnership, it requires the full support of City Council and the DDA, as is the case across the country with similar urban parks.

As you know, the Center of the City is gaining momentum, with recent improvements to Liberty Plaza, resolution to study food trucks on the Library Lot, efforts to secure storage for movable tables and chairs, an expanding roster of events, and private fundraising. As the Council of the Commons expands fundraising, grantors, in particular, will be looking for a strong public-private partnership that includes the city and DDA. Having Ms. Letaw's extremely negative statements out in the public realm -- and having still been appointed by the mayor -- will undermine the credibility of any pledges of public (city and DDA) partnership, now and in the future. Her statements and appointment undermine donor willingness to give by making the park's continuance uncertain while conveying DDA and city opposition. They are extremely detrimental to fundraising efforts. Ms. Letaw is entitled to her opinions as a private citizen, but city council should not make DDA appointments that actively undermine programs it is pursuing, programs to which it has asked citizen volunteers to devote their time and efforts.

I strongly urge you to oppose this renomination. There are plenty of other worthy citizens in our community who can sit on the DDA board.
