Ann Arbor has lofty claims of weaning off car dependency and shifting to a community based on walking, biking, and transit. With a new, potentially visionary city council in session, it is time to fully commit to building the affordable, walkable Ann Arbor we all know it can be.

# Increase Gas Tax Funding for Non-Motorized Transportation

I fully support the resolution, drafted by Transportation Commission Chair Molly Kleinman and Ann Arbor Transportation Manager Raymond Hess, to increase non-motorized transportation funding from 5% to 20% of gas tax funds drafted by. For example, this funding can be used to add protected bike lanes, fund street improvements for pedestrian safety, and purchase a small snowplow, as the lack of a small snowplow has been cited in the past as an obstacle to adding protected bike lanes.

#### Repealing Prop A

Proposal A must be repealed in order to provide a mixed-use development such as the one originally proposed and agreed upon in 2018. Proposal A has been an unmitigated policy disaster draining city resources and preventing the addition of housing and other uses that will \*help\* our housing crisis and add to the city's tax base.

#### City Bike Lane Network

Council must create a detailed plan for developing a comprehensive bike lane network, including a timeline for when the citywide bike network will be complete. While a wonderful first step, the incremental progress has been painfully slow while the vast majority of the city's transportation resources continues to be allocated towards car dependence.

#### Housing

The council needs to commission a housing study and develop a strategic plan around it. The city, as well as the country, is in the midst of a housing crisis. Market-rate rents have skyrocketed, and since the city-commissioned 2015 report recommending the addition of 2800 affordable units over the next 20 years, we have barely added 100. Clearly, the council has the right idea, as they recently eliminated parking minimums, which is an excellent, pioneering first step to addressing the housing shortage. However, Ann Arbor needs a long-term, comprehensive plan to keep housing affordable and allow people of all incomes to experience the wonderful, vibrant city of Ann Arbor, not just the rich.

#### Zoning

In the short-term, allow the next increment of development, by right, across the city. An often overlooked root of our housing crisis is restrictive zoning, which restricts the amount of housing that can be built and causes rents and prices to skyrocket. By limiting the change to only the next increment, the city's neighborhoods will be exempt from radical change, allowing them to retain their "neighborhood character", but no area should be exempt from change.

Street improvements and redesigns to slow down cars

Any and all methods of tactical urbanism and other short- or long-term solutions for our most dangerous streets must be considered as soon as possible. We should not have to wait for more people to die or be seriously injured on our roads. These cheap, quick to implement methods can be used as a proof of concept to present to citizens the benefits of slowed streets while also showing the lack of ensuing traffic issues. These not only align with Ann Arbor's goals to become more walkable and sustainable, but reduction in speed is by far the most important factor in reducing traffic injuries and deaths.

I urge you to support these policies and look forward to discussing them with you in the future. By making these sensible, people-focused decisions, the council will finally be committing to an affordable, inclusive, and walkable Ann Arbor for decades to come.

Thanks for your outreach concerning the East Medical Center Drive (EMCD) bridge project.

We appreciate your thoughts and concerns expressed about the current proposed design of the bridge. From our perspective, the design agreed upon and voted in favor by the city council last February does provide for **the safe passage of both motorized and non-motorized traffic across the EMCD Bridge**. It is our belief that widening of the bridge will not increase vehicular traffic since the intersection at Fuller and EMCD is not being widened, only the 160 linear feet of the bridge. This ensures that there will be no increase in vehicular traffic onto the EMCD bridge. We

understand that you may not agree with us on this design but we do respect and appreciate your perspective and insight.

With all of that being said, if the city council is not in favor of moving forward on the construction contract for this project due to the current design, that is their prerogative. We are, and have always been, willing to partner with the city on joint beneficial projects, like the EMCD bridge. We hope this clarifies UM's and Michigan Medicine's pursuit for the safest project possible for all users, and <u>our continued willingness to collaborate with the city on this project to find an agreeable solution for the city and university.</u> We have let the city know of our willingness to continue to collaborate with them on this issue.



Hello, President Ono, Regents and other U-M leaders. I am writing to you regarding carbon neutrality and transit between north and central campuses in Ann Arbor.

Over the past 27 years, I've been pleased to see improvements in the U-M Ann Arbor campuses for pedestrians, wheelchair users, bikers and bus riders. Looming climate change, of course, makes more rapid progress imperative. Of particular concern to me is the 12-minute bike ride from central campus to north campus (and beyond). The medical campus lies squarely on this route.



In the hundreds of times I've ridden my bike to north campus, it's always been with my heart in my mouth. Riding on high-speed multilane roads with no bike lanes like E. Medical Center Drive is both frightening and unsafe; like many parents I would \*never\* want my own college kids to ride on these roads. Yet there is no safer route.

U-M wants to decrease the carbon we emit and knows expanding cycling is a key tactic. And now is our chance. The E. Medical Center bridge that cyclists must traverse to get to North Campus needs replacing, and U-M and the city are partnering to do so

The problem is that the current design accounts for an increase in automobile traffic but neither an increase in bicycle traffic nor safety improvements. The design increases the number of car lanes -- increasing danger to turning cyclists -- and provides zero cycling infrastructure. It doesn't even increase the sidewalk, where cyclists can be "guests" -- dismounting in the middle of the road to carry their bike up onto the curb and weaving in and out of the heavy pedestrian traffic. The design flies in the face of the U-M President's Commission on Carbon Neutrality's call for a campus:campus bikeway and undercuts U-M's plans to decrease scope 3 emissions.

I am sure we can do better. With the right design you wouldn't have to be brave to ride your bike from central campus to north campus and, given the easy distance and for e-bike riders the electric assist up the hills, I would be joined by many more faculty, staff and students who today are in their cars or on the blue buses. The whole path isn't on the table yet but the bridge is the key piece -- the plan we implement now won't be redone in my lifetime.

We still have time to build the right bridge -- a multi-modal one that safely gets staff and patients to the hospital and gets students and staff from central to north campus regardless of their transit mode. I'm no road engineer, but I'm sure one could design a roadway that serves cyclist and pedestrian traffic in addition to cars and buses.

I urge you to support a new multimodal design for the E. Medical Center bridge that adds these additional requirements:

- 1. Improve cyclist safety
- 2. Accommodates an increase in cycling traffic

With this email/letter I am notifying you of a snow and ice hazard that currently exists on the sidewalk that is on the bridge that goes over State Street on Stadium Blvd. This is a City of Ann Arbor sidewalk and the City is responsible to keep it clear of snow and ice.

On Sunday, January 22, 2023 the sidewalk on the north side of the bridge was not clear and was not salted. However it had snowed during the previous night and during the morning of January 22, 2023. The sidewalk was very slippery making it a serious hazard for the many people walking on the sidewalk to and from the University of Michigan basketball game.

On Sunday I walked on this north sidewalk at 12:35 PM going to the game and at 3:25 PM walking back to my car from the game. Each time the sidewalk going up and then down the bridge was slippery. I had on the hiking boots I use when hiking the Grand Canyon. However I had to be very careful and walk slowly to make sure I didn't slip.

The forecast is for rain and snow tonight (January 23<sup>rd</sup>) and several inches of snowfall before the University of Michigan basketball game on Thursday evening, January 26. It is so very important to have the City clear and salt this sidewalk before the game. Of course the City should continue to keep this sidewalk safe all winter.

I am sure the City does not want to have someone fall and hurt themselves on one of the City sidewalks.
