

Our Streets and Bridges

OF AWV ROBOR

- 300 miles of Streets;
 100 miles of major
 streets + 200 miles of
 residential streets
- 13 Street Bridges
- 33 miles of Bike Lanes
- 31 Pedestrian Refuge Islands
- Over 400 miles of Sidewalks

Pavement Condition




Impacts on Pavements:

- Freeze/Thaw Frost Heave (SE Michigan)
- Underground Utility Failures, Repairs and Replacement, Street Cuts for New Developments (Urban Area)
- Change in Vehicle Type and Loading
- Snow Removal and Salt





Past Street Millages



- Since 1984, Ann Arbor citizens have supported a Street Reconstruction Millage.
- The Street Reconstruction Millage has provided dedicated funding for resurfacing and reconstruction of our streets.
- Through the Street Reconstruction Millage, the City of Ann Arbor has been able to take full advantage of available federal and state funds for completing road and bridge reconstruction projects.
- The 2006 Street Reconstruction Millage will expire in 2011

Gold Walk Friendly Community



- In 2011 City adopted Complete Streets philosophy.
- Enable safe access for all modes of transportation including pedestrians and bicyclists.



Other Modes of Transportation



- Over 15% of Ann Arbor residents walk to work, which is nearly six times the national average.
- The City of Ann Arbor has about 400 miles of sidewalks and 55 miles of shared-use paths.



Sidewalk Maintenance



- •Ann Arbor property owners maintain the sidewalks adjacent to their property.
- •In 2005, City initiated 5-year Citywide sidewalk inspection program, for sidewalk repairs by property owners.
- In 2007 a 5'X5' sidewalk flag replacement cost property owners \$120 (average).
- •Estimated \$500,000 annual sidewalk repair by property owners.
- Property owners do not benefit from the economy of scale when hiring contractors.
- Sidewalk repair enforcement requires City resources and cost.

An Alternative for a Citywide Sidewalk

Repair

•Ease burden on residents by including Citywide sidewalk repairs with the 2011 Street Reconstruction Millage.

•Increase the 2011 Street millage by 0.125 mils for ongoing sidewalk repair.

•\$13.37 annual cost for average assessed home value of \$107,000 (market value of \$214,000)
