1. Thomas Partridge - Expand affordable housing, not medical marijuana; Recall Governor Snyder and Republican legislators; Protect retiree benefits; and Protect access to voting rights (I-4, I-5, I-7 & C-2)

Thomas Partridge, City resident, urged City Council to support affordable housing, not medical marijuana. He also urged the recall of Governor Snyder and the Republican leadership in the Legislature.

## 2. Tom Wieder - Ward boundaries (C-2)

Tom Wieder, Ann Arbor Township resident, spoke in opposition to the redistricting of the City's wards prior to the November General election. He stated it is a bad precedent to make boundary adjustments between the primary and general elections and urged Council to make the changes effective after the November city election.

## 3. John Shea - Redistricting ward boundaries (C-2)

John Shea, attorney for the ACLU of Washtenaw County, spoke in opposition to the redistricting of the City's wards between the August Primary and the November General election. He stated he is not opposed to City staff's proposed changes, but urged Council to implement the changes after the November election.

# 4. Dietrich Bergmann - Fuller Road Station sewer interceptor project (Council Communication)

*Dietrich Bergmann, 868 Asa Gray Drive, spoke in opposition to the proposed Fuller Road Station project.* 

## 5. George Gaston - Fuller Road (Council Communication)

George Gaston, 1217 Island Drive, Apt. 103, spoke in opposition to the proposed Fuller Road station. He urged Council to preserve this land as part of the parks system and noted that there is a website supporting the parks at www.protecta2parks.org.

## 6. Gersh Avery - Medical Marijuana (DC-5)

Gersh Avery, a medical marijuana advocate, thanked Council for their support on the medical marijuana licensing ordinance. He stated there are still some concerns related to patient and caregiver privacy, but he urged the passage of the ordinance.

## 7. Rhory Gould - Medical Marijuana (DC-5)

The speaker was not present.

## 8. Charles Ream - Medical Marijuana (DC-5)

Charles Ream, medical marijuana advocate, urged Council to pass DC-5, relating to the Freedom of Information Act and the confidentiality of records relating to medical marijuana patients.

## 9. James D'Amour - Fuller Road Station (Council Communication)

James D'Amour, 2771 Maplewood, spoke in opposition to the proposed Fuller Road Station project.

## 10. Ann Larimore - Fuller Road northside sewer (Council Communication)

Ann Larimore, 916 Olivia, spoke in opposition to the funding of the Northside Sanitary Sewer Interceptor Project. She stated she is in opposition to this project and the proposed Fuller Road Station that it would support.

## 1. Matthew Abel - Medical Marijuana (DC-5)

Matthew Abel, attorney for Arborside Care, expressed concern about the language in the ordinance for the additional licenses beyond those issued as part of the moratorium. He stated the intent was to issue 20 total licenses, but expressed concern that the 10 percent cap on additional licenses may result in fewer licenses, penalizing those who waited for the ordinance. He urged Council to create a waiting list.

#### COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER HIGGINS

Councilmember Higgins updated Council on the City Administrator Search Committee. She stated that Human Resources is currently conducting preliminary background checks and an announcement regarding finalists would come out later this week.

#### COUNCILMEMBER RAPUNDALO

Councilmember Rapundalo updated Council regarding labor negotiations from the Council Labor Committee. He stated DC-7 has been added to the agenda tonight to approve the collective bargaining agreement with the Police Deputy Chief's Union. Highlights of this agreement include a one-year agreement with no salary increase and the same health care benefits that are currently afforded to the non-union staff. The deputy chiefs have also agreed to be classified as exempt under federal Fair Labor Standards, which will eliminate overtime for this bargaining group. Councilmember Rapundalo stated a tentative agreement was also taken to the AAPOA union, but it was voted down. The City will now go to ACT 312 arbitration with the police officers' union beginning this week.

#### COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

Interim City Administrator Tom Crawford updated Council on the Streets and Sidewalk Reconstruction Millage Survey. Mr. Crawford stated that the survey is closing today (July 5). The City is gathering information from taxpayers to see if they would like to vote on a 1/8th millage to cover future sidewalk repairs. More information is posted at www.a2gov.org/StreetMillage.
