## To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to express my interest in a possible appointment to the Greenbelt Advisory Commission (GAC). As a lifelong area resident I have had a strong interest in the mission and work of the GAC and have kept abreast of its work through televised meetings and meeting minutes as well as press coverage. I was raised in Dexter, Michigan and attended the University of Michigan. I began living permanently in Ann Arbor towards the conclusion of graduate school and at the start of a professional career with the University of Michigan. I have been a homeowner in Ward 5 since December 2002. I believe I bring a unique combination of expertise, experience, and perspective that would be of value to the GAC.

My professional career at the University of Michigan is a research staff and lecturer appointment as an applied geographer where I help faculty and students integrate spatial analysis into their work through the use of Geographic Information Systems. Due to my interests and the because of the researchers I work with I have assisted with a lot of work quantifying the environment, land use/land cover, and public health outcomes related to the built environment using mapping technologies. This experience means I am comfortable assessing and prioritizing the locations and suitability of parcels based upon various criteria that can be mapped.

In 2004 I established a small farming operation on family land in Webster Township. I will note that this is a small parcel in the Brines Family (located at 8218 Donovan Road, Dexter, MI) that is outside of the Greenbelt boundary (and is also I believe outside any of the recently proposed expanded Greenbelt boundaries). This small farm sells year-round produce at the local farmers markets and via a Community Supported Agriculture share model from November through April. We are probably best known in the area as one of the first farms to utilize passive solar hoophouses as a way to harvest and sell fresh greens and cold hardy produce at the Ann Arbor Farmers Market throughout the winter.

I am also active in the local food system through my work with non-profit organizations and service on committees. I serve on the Slow Food Huron Valley board, HomeGrown Festival steering committee, Local Food Summit steering committee, and I have served on the mayor-appointed Public Market Advisory Commission since 2007 as the "daily market vendor" representative.



Recently, I have taken on roles assisting a business incubator project aimed at creating new farm businesses which was established on Ann Arbor Township land this past year: serving on the Tilian Farm Development Center steering committee and Four Season Farmer Development Program advisory team.

I believe in the value of ensuring aesthetically-pleasing open spaces in our area as well as creating a stronger local food system that maintains farming as a viable profession and valued community component. Again, I believe my expertise and experience in our region means I could be a effective contributor to the mission and tasks of the Greenbelt Advisory Commission.
