TRAFFIC PEDESTRIANS CROSSING STREETS

An Ordinance to Amend Section 10:148 of Chapter 126, Traffic, Title X, of the Code of the City of Ann Arbor.

The City of Ann Arbor Ordains:

Section 1: That Section 10:148 of Chapter 126, Traffic, of Title X of the Code of the City of Ann Arbor be amended to read as follows:

10:148. - Pedestrians crossing streets.

(a) When traffic-control signals are not in place or are not in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall stop <u>before entering a crosswalk</u> and yield the right-of-way to any <u>pedestrian stopped at the curb or ramp leading to a crosswalk and</u> to every pedestrian approaching or within a crosswalk, without regard to which portion of the roadway the <u>pedestrian is using</u>.

(b) A pedestrian shall not suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into a path of a vehicle that is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.

(c) Every pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall take effect on the tenth day following legal publication.
