Mayor and Council:

I requested from Safety Services Administrator/Chief of Police Seto a summary of the community meeting held by the City regarding the closure of Main Street during University of Michigan football games. Chief Seto's summary is below. Chief Seto is also proposing a modification to the closure plan in response to concerns received. Chief Seto is proposing to close southbound Main Street one-hour before kick-off and reopen immediately upon conclusion of the game.

Chief Seto and representatives from University of Michigan Public Safety and Federal Department of Homeland Security will be attending tonight's City Council meeting to answer questions you might have regarding the recommended closure. Craig Hupy, Public Services Area Administrator, will also be present to answer questions regarding traffic flow management. Answers to your caucus questions will be provided in the staff response memo that will be sent this afternoon. Attached is a draft of the proposed changes to the resolution.

Comments from Chief Seto:

A community meeting regarding the University of Michigan request for Main Street Closure was held on July 24, 2013. Approximately 30 people were in attendance. Chief Seto, Sgt. Sartori and Mr. Hupy were the City staff members present. The PowerPoint presented during the meeting is attached to this message.

Upon reviewing the comments and suggestions made during the meeting, the following are potential changes to the original request:

- Southbound lanes of Main Street will remain open to all traffic until one hour before the game begins.
 - This will address concerns raised by residents that access to residential lawn parking off of Main Street will be affected and residents will experience a financial impact. Participants advised that many of their customers access their parking off of Main Street and a three hour closure is too early.
- The communication plan will include advising everyone that Main Street will be open after the game.
 - This was suggested so that fans will know that post game traffic is not affected by the pre-game closure.
- Signs limiting local traffic only onto W. Keech, Potter, Berkley and Snyder from Belmar will include information that residential lawn parking is open.

- o This will address the concern by some participants that residential lawn parking near Main Street will be impacted due to confusion of the local traffic only signs.
- Signs and signals staff have begun a review of post game signal timing along out bound W. Stadium Blvd. The goal is to have an improved long signal pattern on outbound W. Stadium to help move post game traffic away from the stadium area. The challenge will be moving traffic through the Stadium/Maple & Jackson intersection. During the season, the Stadium corridor as well as other corridors will be reviewed for further upgrades and adjustments.
 - This will evaluate post game congestion concerns for W. Stadium, regardless if a pre-game Main Street closure is approved.

The attached resolution is to approve a request from the University of Michigan to close Main Street between Stadium and Pauline. Closure for north bound lanes will be from three hours before the game until the game ends. Closure for south bound lanes will be from one hour before the game until the game ends. The applicant, the University of Michigan, in close collaboration with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Ann Arbor Police and other local law enforcements officials, is seeking to enhance security at Michigan Stadium and for the residents who live in nearby neighborhoods by creating a vehicle-free zone around the Michigan Stadium during Saturday UM Football games. The vehicle-free zone would be created by closing E. Keech Street between S. Main and Greene streets, limiting access to parking permit holders on Greene Street from E. Hoover to Keech streets, closing the westbound right-turn lane on E. Stadium Boulevard (onto S. Main Street) just south of the Michigan Stadium, and closing S. Main Street to both local and through traffic from Stadium Boulevard to Pauline. These closures would be effective three hours before a game to the end of the game, with the exception of south bound S. Main Street which will be closed beginning one hour before a game to the end of the game. Vehicle access from the neighborhood streets onto the closed area of S. Main Street would be either prohibited or restricted at police-controlled access points depending on the street to accommodate people needing ingress or egress to properties fronting S. Main Street that have no side-street access. The closed portion of these streets will remain available for pedestrian use and emergency vehicle response to the area.




Additional Information

Dear Ms. Higgins,

I wanted to let you know that I appreciated your No vote on Agenda item DC-2 - Resolution Calling for Repeal of Michigan's Stand Your Ground Law and for Strengthening Firearm Regulations.

I agree that it is unlikely everyone in the city feels this way. I also think that resolutions like this, while I admire the sentiment, and calls for community action they are based upon, are not the best use of City Council time. Lastly, as I pointed out to some of the resolutions sponsors, any call to repeal a Public Act in order to strengthen firearms regulations would have to include a call for the repeal of Public Act 377. Public Act 377, among other effects, removed the ability of municipalities to add further restrictions to the state guidelines for the purchase of handguns. Prior to this act, the City required potential handgun buyers to obtain a License to Purchase before such a purchase could be made. It also compelled the holder of that License to make that purchase in a limited amount of time, and to return the completed license and handgun to the city for a safety check and serial number registration. All of these requirements allowed our law enforcement officers greater insight into the number and type of handguns in our community, and also gave them a look at the purchaser; and I suppose the opportunity to challenge a purchasers fitness to own a handgun. Public Act 377 in my opinion served to weaken our city's firearm regulations, and it's repeal should have been included in any call to strengthen firearms regulations.

I support the right of the people to lawfully obtain and own firearms, under state and federal constitutional protections. But having an informed local police department can go a long way towards reducing gun violence, and protecting the rights of all citizens.

In any event, thank you for the vote, and for your service to the city.
