


How does Ann Arbor Compare?

Competitive Set: Unemployment Rate 2006-2012






Job Growth Washtenaw County 2005-12



Succeeding in Ann Arbor

- \$10K of Grant Support

- They've gone on to raise a total of \$1,800,230 in private capital and currently employ 10 FTE's


