1. Rick Clark - Uber Operating Agreement

Rick Clark, 1267 Davis, of Amazing Blue Taxi, spoke against the City negotiating operating agreements with TNC companies like Lyft and Uber. He stated these agreements are in violation of State law and local ordinance and will not be enforceable.

2. Kermit Schlansker - The Ideal Project

Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall, spoke about the need for energy conservation and the future.

3. Alan Haber - Council Approval of Minutes (A-1) and World Peace Day

Alan Haber, 531 Third Street, spoke about World Peace Day on September 21. He urged City staff to work together and find a solution regarding the concerns with event insurance. Mr. Haber urged Council to allow this event to take place on City property. Mr. Haber stated this event should be sponsored annually by the City.

4. Henry Herskovitz - Communications from Council (CC)

Henry Herskovitz, 404 Mark Hannah, spoke about the issues in Palestine and addressed some comments made by previous speakers regarding the history of this conflict and the United States' involvement.

5. Tom Partridge - Elect Mark Schauer Governor and Gary Peters U.S. Senator. Provide improved access to affordable housing and public transportation. (F-1, G-6, G-7)

Tom Partridge, City resident, spoke in support of the election of Mark Schauer for Governor and Gary Peters for United States Senator.

6. Navin Shah - Grievance regarding Wild Parties and Damage to Property.

Navin Shah, a local landlord, spoke about the damage being done to his property due to the excessive partying in the student neighborhoods on football Saturdays. He asked Council to address the issue.

CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER PETERSEN

Councilmember Petersen stated that the upcoming Commission on Disability Issues meeting on Wednesday, September 17, will be Closed Captioning. Councilmember Petersen thanked the staff at CTN for their leadership on this issue, including Lisa Wondrash, Communications Director.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere stated she is planning to bring a resolution to the next meeting of Council regarding the criteria for the expenditure of the Affordable Housing Trust Fund funds. She stated the Advisory Board has been working on this issue at their last few meetings.

COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman spoke about a pedestrian accident in a crosswalk that occurred near Packard and Easy Street that involved a young student. He stated the crosswalk ordinance is very dangerous on roads with high speeds and multiple lanes of traffic. In this case, one vehicle stopped and the pedestrian was then struck by a passing car. Councilmember Kunselman said he will again be bringing changes to Council to address the safety concerns with the City's current ordinance.

Michael Benson, chair of the Ann Arbor Taxicab Board, spoke about the proposed resolution. He stated this is a test of deregulation, noting that rates must be advertised.
