I'm curious if any consideration was given to blocking Northside to through traffic by installing bollards at Delafield such that cars couldn't cut through. Bollards allow bikes to pass, of course.

Those residents at the east end of Northside would have a bit of distance added to a trip to/from Barton Dr., but it might be preferable for the majority of residents in the area relative to the inconvenience of the speed humps. I imagine that the cost would be less as well.

I haven't looked yet to see if such a bollard installation is in the city's traffic-calming toolkit but I'll check it out. If it's not it would be interesting to know why.
