# 1. Tom Partridge - Planning for a more accessible affordable city environment. Ann Arbor Planning Commission (G-1)

Tom Partridge, City resident, expressed concern about the homeless problem in Ann Arbor and urged Council to make this issue a priority. He welcomed the new mayor and Council to office.

## 2. Seth Best - Winter Emergency Shelter and Warming Center (DC-2)

Seth Best spoke in support of the proposed Resolution regarding funding for the Winter Emergency Shelter and Warming Center Response.

#### 3. George Gatson - Fuller Park Parking Lease (DS-1)

George Gatson, City resident, expressed concerns about the cost analysis conducted on the Fuller Park parking lot lease. He urged Council to consider only the one-year terms.

## 4. Maureen Riley - Ann Arbor Art Fair Street Closures - Welcome Mayor (CA-1)

Maureen Riley, Director of the Street Art Fair, stated she spoke on behalf of all of the fairs in welcoming the new mayor. She thanked Mayor and Council for their support of the Art Fairs.

#### 5. Jeremy Flack - Pension Changes (F-6)

Jeremy Flack, Pension Board Chairperson, representing the City firefighters, spoke in support of the City's current defined benefit program. He urged Council to be cautious of a transition to a defined contribution system.

#### 6. Dave Monroe - Pension Changes (F-6)

Dave Monroe, Pension Board member, representing the Police Department, addressed Council regarding the defined benefit system. He urged Council to engage the employee representatives and the unions to have a dialog before any changes are considered to the structure of the system.

## 7. Catherine Wilkerson - Police Accountability in the Wake of the Aura Rosser Shooting

Catherine Wilkerson, City resident, addressed Council regarding the fatal shooting of Aura Rosser by the Ann Arbor Police Department. She urged the City to be transparent with the investigation.

### 8. Ben Sayler - Antibiotics in Food System

Ben Sayler addressed Council regarding antibiotics in the food system. He urged Council to make Ann Arbor a leader in this issue and to ban the use of antibiotics in food.

### 9. Alan Haber - Comments to Council Remarks

Alan Haber, City resident, addressed Council regarding the shooting of Aura Rosser and race issues within the community. He welcomed the new Council.

## 10. Kathie Weinmann - Antibiotics in Animal Agriculture

Kathie Weinmann spoke about the dangers of a food system that contains antibiotics. She urged Council to consider a ban.

#### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

#### COUNCILMEMBER EATON

Councilmember Eaton reported that there would be a public meeting at Slauson Middle School regarding the Sanitary Sewer Wet Weather Evaluation Study. The meeting will be held Wednesday, November 19 at 6:30 p.m. He noted that the Footing Drain Disconnect program would be discussed.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski addressed the public regarding the shooting of Aura Rosser on November 9, 2014. He noted that while there are still unanswered questions, it is still a very rare event for the Ann Arbor Police Department.

#### COUNCILMEMBER KAILASAPATHY

Councilmember Kailasapathy stated she is the Human Rights Commission liaison and would be requesting that body to open up a policy discussion on Police policies, including the use of tasers, body cameras and shoot to kill policies.

#### COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere thanked the Mayor and Councilmembers Warpehoski and Kailasapathy for addressing the important issues surrounding the shooting death of Ms. Rosser.

*Councilmember Briere reiterated Mr. Powers' reminder regarding the Pedestrian Safety and Access Task Force on Wednesday evening at the downtown library.* 

#### COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm updated Council and the public regarding the deer management efforts. She stated there will be a public meeting on the subject on December 10, 2014 from 6 - 9 p.m. at Huron High School. Councilmember Lumm stated a public survey is also being developed.

#### COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman congratulated Mayor Taylor on his election. Councilmember Kunselman also spoke about the shooting of Ms. Rosser. He stated he trusts the AAPD and urged others to be patient during the investigation. He noted that this is the first tragedy in decades.

#### COUNCILMEMBER EATON

Councilmember Eaton expressed his support for Chief Seto in the investigation. Councilmember Eaton stated this incident could be a reason to reconsider policies. He urged the Human Rights Commission to consider a Citizen Review Board for Police Department incidents.

## MC COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR

Mayor Taylor addressed the shooting of Ms. Aura Rosser by the Ann Arbor Police on Sunday evening, November 9, 2014. He expressed his sympathies to all involved in the incident.

...1(a) The term during which the Property will be made available (the "Term") will be for a period of [two] ONE year[s], beginning on September 1, 2014 and terminating August 31, 2015, unless terminated earlier pursuant to the terms of this Lease.

University shall have the option to renew its Lease of the Property, or a portion thereof, on 90 days advance written notice to the Parks and Recreation Services Manager, for 1 successive [2-year] ONE YEAR period upon the same terms and conditions herein, if mutually agreed upon in writing. Such option to renew is on the condition that the renegotiated lease rental amount shall be agreed upon for the [2-year] ONE-YEAR renewal period. ...

4. ...[Upon initiating formal planning for construction of a new commuter rail station, relocating the Ann Arbor Amtrak intercity passenger station or developing a local connector service contemplating use of a part, or all, of Lot A, City shall notify University of such planning considerations. Notification shall be in writing and will include information regarding University input in the City's planning process. City will work cooperatively with University while considering enhancing transportation service to this location. The planning process will assure both parties' interests are included in all considerations. It is recognized that provision of high capacity public mass transportation service to this site is intended to increase access and mobility resulting in a decrease in the need for surface parking by University. Notwithstanding the above, it is understood by the parties that participation by University in the planning process does not negate or otherwise impact City's right to terminate this Lease for the reason stated.]
