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A third-party administrator (TPA) is an organization that processes insurance claims or certain aspects of employee benefit plans for a separate entity. This can be viewed as "outsourcing" the administration of the claim processing since the TPA is performing a task traditionally handled by an insurance company. The City of Ann Arbor has been self-insured in the State of Michigan for a number of years and thus, a TPA is used to handle the processing of its Workers' Compensation claims.

A number of third-party administrators exist in the United States and no two companies are alike. Some TPAs operate as units of insurance companies while others are independent. Claim management philosophies and services offered may differ greatly among companies. Furthermore, some TPAs have regional, national and global capabilities. Thus, it is important to select a TPA that meets your needs.

When selecting a TPA, a number of criteria should be considered, including:

- Service team
- Industry experience
- Adjuster claim capacity
- Claim management philosophy
- Medical expertise
- Claim reviews
- Ancillary services such as loss control

The City of Ann Arbor has a longstanding partnership with CompOne Administrators but alternative TPAs exist. Some of the largest and most recognizable third party administrators are as follows:

While these TPAs generate a substantial amount of revenue (\$300,000,000+) each year, their services tend to be expensive and oftentimes they can be rigid in their approach, which doesn't always produce the best results for a customer.
