Whereas, on Monday, April 20, 2015 the City Administrator put forth a proposed City budget that included proposed funding for the Allen Creek Greenway Master Plan consistent with the City's Parks & Recreation Open Space (PROS) Plan,

Whereas, the current PROS plan recommends that a master plan for the Allen Creek Greenway be developed in cooperation with potential stakeholders,

Now, therefore, after due consideration, the Parks Advisory Commission supports the passage of a City Budget that includes funds for the Allen Creek Greenway Master Plan in the amounts proposed by the City Administrator.

G1 Deer Management Plan

S. Bahl gave an update on the Deer Management Plan. He gave a presentation that highlighted feedback from public meetings and surveys. The recommendations will go to Council in May.

H NEW BUSINESS

H1 15-0464 Resolution to Recommend Approval of a Contract with Best Asphalt to Rebuild the Tennis and Basketball Courts at Allmendinger and Hunt Parks (\$168,595.60)

C. Smith gave background and explained the need to update the tennis courts.

The Resolution reads as follows:

Whereas, The Allmendinger and Hunt Park tennis and basketball courts are in disrepair and in need of major renovation,

Whereas, The Parks and Recreation Open Space Plan recommends infrastructure improvements for tennis and basketball courts that are in disrepair;

Whereas, Funding is available in the approved FY2015 Parks Maintenance and Capital Improvements Fund;

Whereas, Competitive bids were received by Purchasing on March 11, 2015;

Whereas, Best Asphalt submitted the lowest responsive bid;

RESOLVED, That the Park Advisory Commission recommend approval of a contract with Best Asphalt to rebuild the tennis and basketball courts at Allmendinger and Hunt

Parks, and approve a construction contingency of \$16,860 (10%) to cover potential contract change orders for a total contract amount of \$185,455.60 for the life of the project without regard to fiscal year.

Whereas, Parks & Recreation Services review existing fees annually as part of the budget process; and

RESOLVED, That fees for Parks and Recreation Services be adjusted according to the attached schedules;

RESOLVED, That the attached fee schedules become effective according to the dates in the attached schedules; and

RESOLVED, That the Parks Advisory Commission recommends that the Mayor and City Council approve the proposed fees.

The resolution reads as follows:

Whereas, a vibrant, extensive, and healthy parks system is part of every great town and city;

Whereas, Ann Arbor residents value their parks, natural areas and recreational facilities and support these amenities through their taxes and patronage;

Whereas, the Parks Advisory Commission (PAC) commends staff for their continued efforts to engage PAC members in the budget process, and in producing a budget

draft that follows PAC's recommended budget priorities to sustain facilities and activities for all residents, but especially children, low income residents, and seniors, particularly where these services are not otherwise available;

RESOLVED, That PAC recommends that City Council approve the Administrator's recommended budget for Parks and Recreation Services and Park Operations developed by staff highlighting the following items:

1. Increased revenue budget resulting from increased participation and adjusted fees

2. New programs that reflect programming trends

3. Increased expenditure budget in order to accommodate busier facilities with the goal of providing outstanding visitor experiences

4. Capital projects that focus on rehabilitating existing infrastructure and improvements where sustainable and practicable
