The presence of a coal tar sealant shall be presumed if:

- 1. A laboratory test result shows a level of one or more polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAH) in excess of one (1) percent-by-weight in a dry scraping sample, which the "Agency" has, or has caused to be, extracted;
- 2. A person, or the person's employee or other agent, acknowledges the use, sale, offer, or permission to use the substance containing it; or
- 3. A person has used, sold, offered, or permitted the use of a substance from a can, tank, truck, pump, or other container that has been accompanied by a document, including a sign, label or material safety data sheet (MSDS), describing contents to include one of the following:
  - a. "Coal tar";
  - b. "Refined tar";
  - c. "Coal tar pitch";
  - d. "Refined coal tar pitch";
  - e. "Refined coal tar";
  - f. "High temperature coal tar";
  - g. "High temperature coal tar pitch";
  - h. "RT-12"; or
  - i. A Chemical Abstracts Service number (CAS #) characterizing coal tar, including CAS #65996-93-2, 65996-90-9, and 8007-45-2.

The presumption can be rebutted with competent, material, and substantial evidence.
