I – Call to Order

Chairperson Leslie Stambaugh called the meeting to order at 7:05. Aimee Carroll recorded the minutes. A quorum of **Commission** members was present, and the meeting, having been duly convened, was ready to proceed with business.

II – Opening

- HRC phone and email: No new phone messages/complaints. There were two emails. The first was a continuation of the racial profiling complaint discussed at the March meeting. The commission received more information about one of those complaints – possible racial profiling -- and it is being looked into.

Citizen's Review Exploration

• Updates:

- D. Wilson shared things that were crucial to him regarding this issue.
 - Community Policing with the goal of a safe community
 - Common Unity: Everyone being unified around the idea of safety and respect.
 - Accountability with transparent policing with oversight and community support. It is important to understand that we are all responsible for creating a safe community
 - Common Understanding that mediation may be required.

- Empathy: The police must understand empathy.
- Structure: We have to build a structure that can last and is policy focused. See ourselves as liaisons dedicated to preventing unfortunate risks to public safety.
- D. Wilson shared a document listing the goals of the oversight committee.
- The first draft of a report written by the interns is due April 25th. D. Wilson will review the draft with the subcommittee members and the interns. The subcommittee's next meeting will be May 6, 2015.
