Dear Council members, dear Mayor Taylor,

I am writing you to share my strong opposition to the decision you made to hire sharpshooters to kill 100 deer this winter.

My opposition is factual and based on the following considerations:

- 1. Recent aerial surveys did not identify an overpopulation of Deer, as they show density levels well below the DNR limit for an urban area. There is insufficient data to establish trends over time and aerial surveys are known to be a very inaccurate measurement method. No decision should be made based on such inaccurate data.
- 2. The number of Deer-Vehicle accidents is very low for a City of our size, Bicycle-Vehicle accidents are more numerous and should take precedence in terms of budget allocation. There are also efficient and long-term solutions to prevent Deer vs. Car accidents.
- 3. Killing Deer is an inefficient and extremely short-term mean to control their population as it creates an eco-system unbalance that result in a quick long term population rebound.
- 4. Managing a garden in a natural setting implies making concession for native plant and animal species. Rochester Hills Gardening with Deer is a great example.

Dear Mrs. Lumm and Mr. Warpehoski,

I would like to thank you both for responding quickly to my letter. This proves that despite our differing opinions we all agree on taking this issue seriously and that you are open to a dialog.

As you have stated, the long term potential risks of a Deer (or any other species) overpopulation are very serious and should not be taken lightly. Fear though, can lead to hurried decisions and undesirable results especially with irreversible actions such as a cull. It would take just one stray bullet or a Deer frightened by a shot jumping in front of a vehicle to send our community in shock.

Deer population is very difficult to measure, and long-term data is absolutely necessary to making any decision on population control. Incidental sightings, or punctual vegetation reports are inadequate to that effect and cannot responsibly be used for an action of this importance. Deer food is possibly the best method to observe over the long term through its interaction with its eco-system. It can also be used to control its population. The decision you made to ban Deer feeding is certainly an attempt in that direction. Have you collected long-term "before" vegetation data that will allow you to measure the true effect of that decision? This is essential since the removal of an existing (artificial) source of food could drive Deer to another (natural) source such as new tree growth... Any action to change the current eco-balance should be measured and planned carefully.

Deer is not just an other species as they are one of the most evolved life forms in our immediate environment. They are mammals just like us, and display elaborate social patterns. It is our responsibility to treat them humanly.

Our City is uniquely positioned as it has the human potential and therefore the duty to perform a more comprehensive assessment of the situation and identify innovative solutions. U of M School of Natural Resources & Environment (SNRE) has no less than 68 PhD right here on Church Street. The strength of our community is shown by our ability to turn our challenges in victories. For example, a specific SNRE study funded by Public/Private partnership supported by volunteer from the community and by donations could be a great example of how we solve problems in Ann Arbor.

Let's make sure we do not let this issue be a source of division as we deserve better. Let's be Victors!

Question #4: Toll Brothers told some neighborhood representatives that they would collect all the concerns from the neighborhoods. They also said they would compile and provide this information to the City. Has this been done? If so, could you please provide that information.

We have met with the Foxfire, Foxridge, Ashford, Orchard and Bromley Communities and have extended an invitation out to Arbor Hills and Chapel Hill Communities (no response as of yet).

The meetings were mostly focused on the traffic and intersection issues. Other notable topics were:

- 1) Nixon corridor traffic study (if we supported it): we have provided additional roadway easement for future use if the city decides to use it.
- 2) <u>Average sales prices of each product.</u>: currently South is approx. upper 200's and North is upper 300's

- 3) Density. North is approx. 3 units/acre, South is approx. 7 units/acre
- 4) How will the HOA be managed and how the common area will be maintained. : HOA manager will be in place from the first closing. The common area associated with the development will be maintained in perpetuity by the community association.
- 5) What happens if the City doesn't build the intersection. We are currently researching the answer.
- 6) What is the impact of the water run-off? After many design meetings with the Water Resource Commission, the impact will be very minimal (Atwell for details)
- 7) What will the lighting plan entail within the community? We understand that the surrounding communities as well as our buyers will prefer downward lighting as opposed to 180 degree lighting, which is found to be an annoyance.
- 8) Can anything be done with the street view on Nixon Road (townhomes)? We have created more open space between buildings along Nixon Road as well as created a "meandering" sidewalk similar to the most recently completed sidewalk project on the East side of Nixon Road.
- 9) <u>Can there be a more dense buffer between Fox Ridge and Nixon South?</u> As well as adjusting the building arrangement in response to the community responses, We are looking into various strategies of tree plantings to create a suitable buffer between the neighboring residences.

The developer has responded to all of these questions during the various meetings and have also made some significant contributions:

- \$1.+M funding for the intersection.
- Changes to the Nixon South at Nixon Road- sidewalk and street elevation/open space changes.

Question #16: In requesting postponement until tonight's meeting, the developer indicated they would be setting up meetings with neighborhood associations. Can you please provide a status update on those meetings – notes/minutes on discussion items/neighborhood input for any meetings that have been held, and the times/locations for meetings scheduled? (Lumm)

We have, as indicated above, met with Fox Ridge and Fox Fire since our last City Council Meeting. The other meetings were prior to our last meeting. We have extended an invitation to meet with the Arbor Hills community as well as Chapel Hill and are still waiting for a response. A notable meeting request that has gone un answered is to Mr. James D'Amour of the Sierra Club-Huron Valley Group in response to his comments during our annexation council meeting.

Dear Council members, dear Mayor Taylor,

I am writing you to share my strong opposition to the decision you made to hire sharpshooters to kill 100 deer this winter.

My opposition is factual and based on the following considerations:

- 1. Recent aerial surveys did not identify an overpopulation of Deer, as they show density levels well below the DNR limit for an urban area. There is insufficient data to establish trends over time and aerial surveys are known to be a very inaccurate measurement method. No decision should be made based on such inaccurate data.
- 2. The number of Deer-Vehicle accidents is very low for a City of our size, Bicycle-Vehicle accidents are more numerous and should take precedence in terms of budget allocation. There are also efficient and long-term solutions to prevent Deer vs. Car accidents.
- 3. Killing Deer is an inefficient and extremely short-term mean to control their population as it creates an eco-system unbalance that result in a quick long term population rebound.
- 4. Managing a garden in a natural setting implies making concession for native plant and animal species. Rochester Hills Gardening with Deer is a great example.
