RESOLVED, That the Ann Arbor City Council proposes that the City Charter be amended by modifying Section 8:20 to read as follows:

Funds for Street and Bridge Resurfacing and Reconstruction, and for Sidewalk Repair Streets, Bridges, and Sidewalks

SECTION 8.20. In addition to any other amount which the City is authorized to raise by general tax upon the real and personal property by this Charter or any other provision of law, the City shall, in 20122017 through 20162021, annually levy a tax of up to 2.125 mills on all taxable real and personal property situated within the City for the purpose of providing funds for the reconstruction or resurfacing repair of streets and bridges, and for repair and construction of sidewalks.

RESOLVED, That a special election be held on August 2, 2016;

RESOLVED, That August 2, 2016 is designated as the day for holding an special election on the proposed Charter amendment;

RESOLVED, That the Clerk shall transmit a copy of the proposed amendment to the Attorney General and the Governor of Michigan and shall perform all other acts required by law for holding the election;

RESOLVED, That the proposed Charter amendment shall appear on the ballot in the following form:

# ANN ARBOR CITY CHARTER AMENDMENT TAX FOR STREET AND BRIDGE REPAIR AND FOR SIDEWALK REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION

Shall the Charter be amended to authorize a <u>new</u> tax up to 2.125 mills for street and
bridge repair and for sidewalk repair and construction for 2017 through 2021 to replace
the previously authorized tax up to 2.125 mills for street and bridge reconstruction and
resurfacing and for sidewalk repair for 2012 through 2016, which will raise in the first
year of levy the estimated revenue of \$11,249,000?

Dear Team,

Sending you some background on the street and sidewalk millage proposals – on tonight's council agenda. Long story, but there are two versions up for council consideration. One version was put forward by Sabra Briere (with w/support from Chris Taylor, Chip Smith – and, probably the council majority) which is not actually a renewal, but a changed proposal. Their version of a ballot referendum will propose to divert \$ to other uses (e.g., pedestrian safety task force recommendations for crosswalk beacons, bicycle amenities, et. al. alternative transportation improvements), and not propose to simply allocate \$ to fixing roads and repairing sidewalks. I said that if we want to fund the pedestrian safety and access task force recommendations, then we need to be honest with voters, and consider a different/separate millage. The Interim Administrator, Tom Crawford, met with all of council to discuss the timing and the millages themselves. We agreed that placing this on the August ballot made sense, but there was not agreement on how to allocate this \$. The resolutions I placed on tonight's agenda will allocate the funds as a true renewal – allocating the funds as they have always been utilized, to fix the roads and, since the approval of the sidewalk millage in 2011, to repair the sidewalks.

We passed, at the last council mtg., a resolution directing staff to bring forward the ballot language for council approval. I was surprised, unhappily so, to receive the language sent out by CM Briere on Friday. I feel strongly that if council wants to change the use, that should be a council discussion and the base renewal language should have been presented council, by staff — it was not, and hence my scramble to resurrect the language that voters have previously been presented and supported.

Received a very nice letter from a 2<sup>nd</sup> ward constituent endorsing fixing the roads and sidewalks — the needs, I know I don't have to tell you, are great — and I will share that letter with you.

Sending you this as an fyi. I'll also forward questions I sent City Attny. Abby Elias (have not yet rec'd. responses) re: the uses contemplated for the street and sidewalk millages – I submitted these Q's after the council mtg. w/Tom Crawford, the meeting where I learned that other CM's were looking at these millages to do other projects (viz., for alternative transportation purposes vs. strickly street and sidewalk repair).

Jack, of course, and I'm sure Sumi, support the attached renewal language (i.e., not the language submitted by CM Briere – language which proposes to divert street and sidewalk millage \$'s to also be utilized for alternative transportation uses). We do have an Alternative Transportation Fund – for trains, connectors....
