#### 1. Rita Mitchell - New Amtrak Station (DC-1)

*Rita Mitchell, 621 Fifth Street, spoke in support of resolution DC-1 and the release of City communications regarding the proposed new Amtrak station.* 

#### 2. Neel Hajra - Coordinated Funding (DS-1)

Neel Hajra, 2408 Sun Valley Drive, spoke about DS-1, the resolution regarding the annual coordinated funding plan. He spoke in support of the community coordinated funding model versus individual funding from each agency.

#### 3. Rebecca Esselman - Pavement Sealant Ordinance (C-1)

Rebecca Esselman, 1100 N. Main, on behalf of the Huron River Watershed Council, spoke in support of C-1, an ordinance regulating coal tar pavement sealers. She spoke about the environmental risks of using coal tar sealants and urged Council to support the proposed regulations.

#### 4. Eileen Dickinson - Bee Safe Neighborhoods (DC-5)

*Eileen Dickinson, 534 Fourth Street, thanked the City for bringing forward the Bee City resolution and urged Council's support. She stated the public can pledge support at various levels, including not using lawn chemicals and planting bee-friendly plants.* 

#### 5. Vince Caruso - New Amtrak Station (DC-1)

Vince Caruso, 556 Glendale, spoke in support of DC-1 and urged Council to release City communications regarding the City's plans for a new Amtrak station.

#### 6. Dave Cicotte - Commercial Quadricycle Operating Permit Fees (DC-3)

Dave Cicotte, High Five Pedal Tours (Note: this speaker's comments addressed B-1 and he was referred to speak on this topic during the public hearing section of the agenda.)

#### 7. Michael Miller - FY17 & FY18 Allocations to Non-Profit Entities (DS-1)

Michael Miller spoke in support of DS-1 and the coordinated funding model.

#### 8. Linda Smith - Swift Run Project

Linda Smith, 3171 LaSalle, spoke in opposition to the Swift Run project, including proposed right-of-way rain gardens. She stated the "pop-outs" are dangerous to traffic. She urged Council to consider a larger street such as Packard for this project.

#### 9. Alan Haber - Library Lot

Alan Haber, 531 Third Street, spoke about the need for a central park in the City, noting that he turned in over 5000 signatures today to place this question on the ballot.

#### 10. Mozhgan Savabieassahani - Boycott Israel (Declined to speak.)

Ms. Savabieassahani declined to speak.

#### 1. Greg Briggs - International Refugee Day

Greg Briggs, local minister, spoke in support of DC-6, the Welcoming Communities Campaign, and urged community support for our Muslims neighbors and refugees.

#### 2. Blaine Coleman - Boycott Israel

Blaine Coleman, resident, urged Council to boycott Israel. He questioned the lack of support from Council on a resolution critical of Israel.

#### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

#### COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm spoke about a public meeting regarding the Dhu Varren, Nixon, Green Roads intersection on Wednesday, June 8 at Clague Middle School in the Multi-purpose Room from 6 - 8 p.m. City staff and consultants will be present to answer questions.

#### COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere spoke about the Dexter Ann Arbor Run and the change in the route course for the 5K race. She stated race organizers did not alert neighbors or the public of the change and residents on Pontiac Trail were stuck for more than an hour due to the street closure changes. She urged staff to try harder with event planning and communications.

#### COUNCILMEMBER KRAPOHL

Councilmember Krapohl alerted Council and the public that today is the anniversary of D-Day. He recognized and thanked the Veterans in Ann Arbor for their service.

Councilmember Krapohl also informed Council of a Lansdowne Neighborhood meeting on Tuesday, June 7 in the Lawton School Auditorium from 6 - 8 p.m. regarding the Delaware pedestrian bridge project funding and next steps.

#### COUNCILMEMBER EATON

Councilmember Eaton spoke to Mr. Coleman and stated that Councilmember Warpehoski is not alone. Council as a whole has chosen not to pass a resolution to boycott Israel.

Councilmember Eaton also spoke about the Delaware Pedestrian Bridge meeting and urged other Council Members to attend the meeting.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski spoke about the Lansdowne Delaware bridge and stated he is now supportive of the funding level.

He also addressed the Historic District Commission awards, noting that the University

was recognized this year with three awards. Councilmember Warpehoski urged the UM to continue to preserve and protect their buildings going forward.

#### COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand stated there is a citizen participation meeting on Tuesday, June 7 at Mallet's Creek Library from 6:30 - 8 p.m. regarding a proposed rezoning on Packard.

Councilmember Grand also addressed the public comments directed at Councilmember Warpehoski and spoke in defense of him, stating she is glad to have Councilmember Warpehoski as a colleague.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WESTPHAL

Councilmember Westphal spoke about a proposed cell phone use while driving ordinance, that he had previously indicated he would be sponsoring. Councilmember Westphal stated he has since learned that the State has preempted municipalities from regulating this issue. Councilmember Westphal stated he is working with the City Attorney's Office on other ways to address distracted driving locally.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMAN

Councilmember Ackerman spoke about an ordinance he plans to bring forward that would allow waivers and fee reductions for low-income families to connect alarm systems.

David Cicotte, owner of High Five Pedal Pubs, expressed concern about the proposed ordinance including a requirement for passenger seatbelts, citing some safety concerns. He also encouraged Council to allow alcohol consumption on the quadricycles. Mr. Cicotte also urged Council to allow operation on special event days, such as UM football games, stating this is how his business gets noticed and he gets future customers.

The manager of Trolley Pub, Tristan, spoke in opposition to the restriction of alcohol consumption on quadricycles. He urged Council to reconsider this restriction. He also concurred with the comments of the previous speaker.

*Kyle Lady, Vice-chair of the Taxicab Board, questioned the restriction of commercial quadricycle operation on all Michigan Stadium event days.* 

There being no further comment, the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

#### MICHAEL BENSON

Michael Benson, Ward 2 resident, spoke about Council Rules and the regulation of signs in the Council Chamber, noting an unattended sign in the Chamber. He also encouraged a Council Member to join the City's Taxicab Board.
