Subject: Strongly Opposed to Installation of Solar Panel at 2815 Brockman

Dear Elected Officials and Commission Representatives (see distribution below):

We strongly oppose the installation of a solar collector in our neighborhood at 2815 Brockman Boulevard. Recently, residents at 2815 Brockman Boulevard sent a letter to concerned next-door neighbors stating they intend to proceed with the front-yard installation of a solar collector. The proposed ground-mounted solar collector in the front yard of 2815 Brockman is **extremely large**: 44 feet long, 9 feet wide (396 square feet, larger than many garages), and nearly 9 feet high. The average setback of neighboring houses from the sidewalk is 103 ft; proposed installation will be 40 ft from the sidewalk. Ann Arbor needs a specific set of solar zoning rules and a permitting process. There are no zoning ordinances for ground-mounted solar collectors in residential neighborhoods. This issue was first brought to the attention of City Council, the Planning Commission, and the Energy Commission in early December 2016. Hank Vanderploeg and John Godfrey expressed views of neighbors at meetings of the Council and both commissions' **Council members and commissioner agreed that front-yard installations were not appropriate in residential neighborhoods**. This installation will create a citywide precedent and open the door for similar projects in residential front yards.

We understand that the Planning Commission is in the process of preparing recommendations to the

We understand that the Planning Commission is in the process of preparing recommendations to the Council for changes in zoning to **prohibit solar installations anywhere in the front yard**. We and many other residents in our neighborhood are pleading with you to make this very prohibition clearly stated in the zoning laws.

Please place a moratorium on installation of ground-mounted solar collectors in residential districts until the city has completed the revision of its zoning ordinances. Thank you for listening and adhering to the concerns of voting residents.
