1. Frank Wilhelme - Library Lot (DS-3)

Frank Wilhelme, 1405 Lutz, spoke in opposition to DS-3, the sale of development rights of the Library Lot to CORE Spaces.

2. Jeff Hayner - Library Lot (DS-3)

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, spoke about CA-7, C-1 and G-4. He expressed concerns about these items. He also spoke in opposition to DS-3, stating it is offensive to many to use affordable housing as leverage for approval to develop this site.

3. Eric Lipson - Library Lot (DS-3)

Eric Lipson, 1318 Rosewood, spoke in opposition to DS-3, and the building of a 17-story building on the Library Lot. He urged Council to postpone action on this item until the IRS audit of the Build America Bonds is complete.

4. John Haines - Library Lot (DS-3)

John Haines, 322 E. Liberty Street, a resident adjacent to the Library Lot, spoke in opposition to DS-3, and the development proposed by CORE Spaces.

5. Victoria Swanson - Library Lot (DS-3)

Victoria Swanson, 634 Harriet, spoke in support of affordable housing and noted the many citizens and volunteers who previously supported the planning and zoning process that allow this project to proceed.

6. Caleb Poirier - Library Lot (DS-3)

Caleb Poirier, 805 W. Huron, spoke in support of affordable housing and thanked the many residents who wanted to speak and were not able to get a speaking slot this evening. He urged residents to continue to fight for and support affordable housing. He stated Washtenaw County is considering a project for affordable housing on May 4. He urged affordable housing advocates to continue to fight.

7. Peter Nagourney - Library Lot (DS-3)

Peter Nagourney, 914 Lincoln, spoke in opposition to the CORE Spaces proposal, DS-3. He urged Council either to reject the proposal or to postpone this item.

8. Jean Carlberg - Affordable Housing - Library Lot (DS-3)

Jean Carlberg, 1902 Independence, spoke in support of DS-3, and in support of affordable housing. She stated the \$5,000,000 contribution to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund can be leveraged for many more affordable developments. She urged Council to support this project.

9. Amanda Carlisle - Library Lot (DS-3)

Amanda Carlisle, 1317 Minerva, spoke in support of DS-3 and the contribution from the project to the affordable housing trust fund.

10. Aubrey Patino - Library Lot (DS-3)

Aubrey Patino, 3068 Turnberry, Associate Director of Avalon Housing, spoke in support of DS-3 and the donation from the sale to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

PUBLIC COMMENT - GENERAL (3 MINUTES EACH)

Edward Vielmetti, Ward 4, expressed concern about late agenda items, including DC-2, regarding solar panels. He also noted several sets of board minutes on the Clerk's Report that were not submitted timely.

Peter Nagourney, resident, expressed concern about the lack of attention and respect that is given by Council to the audience and the public.

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, agreed with the previous speaker regarding the public not having a voice. He objected to the way that Council treated the public in this process.

Alexandria Schultz, on behalf of Stop Trump Ann Arbor, presented a petition to call on City leaders to pass policies resisting the Trump Administration and to pass a resolution declaring Ann Arbor a sanctuary city.

David Silkworth, Ward 5 City Council candidate, stated if he were a current Council Member, he would have voted no on this project. He stated the majority of the public is opposed to the Core Spaces project.

Stephen Kunselman, 2885 Butternut Street, thanked Council for taking his idea to fund affordable housing through parking revenue. He stated he looks forward to this policy being approved. He urged Council to move \$500,000.00 in the budget to affordable housing to address this issue immediately.

Kai Petainen, resident, thanked Mayor Taylor for his decorum in addressing the public on controversial issues.

Odile Haber, resident, expressed concern about Council's lack of a democratic process.

Caleb Poirier, 805 W. Huron, spoke about the difficult decision that Council had to make to approve the CORE Spaces project.

Steve Gutterman, resident, spoke about density and the complexity of affordable housing.

Steve Carter, Ward 5, spoke about his disappointment with the amount of attorney/client privileged communication that Council receives. He said Ann Arbor residents deserve to have all of the information as well.

Alan Haber, resident, spoke about public spaces. He stated some things should not be for sale.

Michael Benson, Ward 2, thanked staff for the safety campaign. He also noted that he read the LDFA minutes and found that the chair made a motion. He encouraged Council to discourage chairs from making motions. He also talked about Council Rules and limiting the number of speakers on one topic to allow others an opportunity to speak.

Linh Song, resident, thanked Council for the designation of Ann Arbor as a sanctuary city.

Councilmember Warpehoski responded to a citizen comment regarding attorney client privileged information. He stated there are many times when it doesn't make sense to publicize the City's legal strategy, such as with pending litigation.

Councilmember Kailasapathy stated she requested that the City Administrator release the information regarding the Dykema decision. She stated the public bond issue should have been made transparent.
