This petition is filed by the City pursuant to the provisions of Section 463 of Chapter 20 of Acts No. 40 of the Public Acts of 1956, as amended.

It is understood that none of the proposed drain project attributable to the part of the project in the City will be paid for by a special assessment levied against the City of Ann Arbor.

A certified copy of the resolution of the governing body of the City of Ann Arbor authorizing execution of this petition is attached hereto.

Inasmuch as the funding for this project is anticipated to include the pass-through of federal awards from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, the County has determined through its analysis and interpretation of the applicable federal regulations (as provided in U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, §____.210 Subrecipient and Vendor Determinations) that the City of Ann Arbor is serving in the capacity of a vendor or contractor, as opposed to a subrecipient. As such, funding hereunder is not considered to be pass-through of federal awards from Washtenaw County to the City of Ann Arbor.
