1. Nancy Shiffler - Ann Arbor Station Environmental Review (CA-13)

Nancy Shiffler, on behalf of the Sierra Club of Huron Valley, spoke regarding CA-13, an amendment with URS Corporation Great Lakes, Inc. Ms. Shiffler expressed concerns about the presentation of the resolution and some of the missing information. She also stated more time for public comment on this issue is needed. COUNCILMEMBER EATON

Councilmember Eaton thanked Mayor Taylor for his leadership for speaking on behalf of the City of Ann Arbor in support of the Paris Climate Change Agreement.

Councilmember Eaton urged the City to continue to show leadership in climate change issues, in spite of a lack of direction from Washington.

Councilmember Eaton also announced that a public meeting would be held to discuss the plans for the Scio Church Road improvements. The meeting will be held at the Pittsfield Branch of the Ann Arbor Library on Wednesday, June 14 at 6:30 p.m.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm thanked staff for the removal of CA-16 from the agenda, stating there are still a lot of unresolved questions regarding a proposed Fuller Road crosswalk.

COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMAN

Councilmember Ackerman announced an upcoming listening session with Hillard Heintz, the City's Police Department independent auditor. The session will be June 13.
