PUBLIC COMMENT - GENERAL (3 MINUTES EACH)

Kathy Griswold, 2nd Ward, spoke about pedestrian safety and urged Council to update the pedestrian crossing ordinance. She stated Ann Arbor's special ordinance could be problematic as autonomous vehicles are designed.

Edward Vielmetti, 4th Ward, spoke about the LDFA meeting and stated agendas of recent meetings have not been posted. He stated he was informed this was a staffing issue. He urged the City to address the issue.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski addressed public concerns regarding the City's pedestrian crossing ordinance. He stated the Federal Highway Safety Administration acknowledges that ordinances that require stopping for pedestrians at the curb are stronger ordinances.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm also addressed pedestrian safety and thanked Councilmember Eaton for bringing the issue back to Council. She noted that the pedestrian crossing ordinance in Ann Arbor is so unusual even the UM does not enforce it.

MAYOR TAYLOR

Mayor Taylor also addressed the pedestrian safety ordinance and noted that the University of Michigan does not routinely follow or enforce any of the City's ordinances, as they are not required to under law.
