Laura Strowe, 1327 Broadway, spoke in opposition to C-1, the rezoning of 1140 Broadway, stating the building masses are out of scale with the surrounding neighborhood.

2. Steve Kaplan - Lowertown Broadway Development (C-1)

Steve Kaplan, 406 N. Division, spoke in support of the proposed rezoning of 1140 Broadway.

3. Nirmala Hanke - Deer (AC-2)

Nirmala Hanke, 2263 Manchester, spoke about the City's upcoming deer cull and urged the City to consider non-lethal methods.

4. Sabra Sanzotta - 450 Feet Rule Not Being Observed in the Deer Management Plan (AC-2)

Sabra Sanzotta, 3087 Glazier Way, spoke in opposition to the City's upcoming deer cull and the waiving of the 450 feet rule regarding shooting near residential homes.

5. Kermit Schlansker - Starting a Revolution

Kermit Schlansker, Saline resident, spoke about alternative energy sources and urged Mayor and Council to be the advocates for this change and to promote energy education in schools.

6. Adam Brent - Protest of Appointment of New Vendor for RFP-17-25

Adam Brent, Cocoa Compost Founder and CEO, expressed concerns about the current state of the City's compost operation and the renewal of the WeCare Organics contract under RFP 17-25.

7. Charles Ream - Dispensary Closures

Charles Ream, 1911 Packard, spoke about his history with cannabis legislation in Ann Arbor and Michigan. He urged the Mayor and Council to support the existing medical marijuana businesses in Ann Arbor and to support legislation that protects them.

8. Gordon Smith - Housing

Not present.

9. Kai Petainen - Train Station

Kai Petainen, resident, spoke about the proposed train station in Ann Arbor, stating the federal government or the University of Michigan should pay for the site. He spoke in support, but also urged the City to use funds to support the environment.

10. Chandani Wiersba - Research Project on Diversity in Local Elected Officials

Chandani Wiersba, CivCity intern, spoke about diversity in local government and elected officials. She stated she will be sending out a survey after the November election regarding diversity, which will include categories such as race, age, education, etc.

CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER EATON

Councilmember Eaton stated he was happy to hear that the City Administrator had met with the DDA regarding suicide prevention measures on the City's parking structures, noting that another death occurred today. He also urged the City to ensure the bid process for the fencing and other physical barriers is a public process.

COUNCILMEMBER KAILASAPATHY

Councilmember Kailasapathy spoke about self-driving vehicles and the City's crosswalk ordinance. She stated the engineers involved in the autonomous vehicle program were aware of the RRFBs in Ann Arbor, but not the requirement to stop for someone waiting without entering the crosswalk.

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski spoke about the incidents that occurred today, including the mass shooting in Las Vegas. He urged all Councilmembers and community members to take part in the County blood drive on October 20 or to give blood at any time. He also reminded Council of the Skate Against Hate event on Sunday, October 8. He urged all to attend.

COUNCILMEMBER WESTPHAL

Councilmember Westphal spoke about gun policy reform. He also thanked the public speaker who addressed public engagement opportunities and noted the last day to register to vote for the November 7 General Election is October 10.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm spoke about the autonomous vehicle program and the questions regarding whether the vehicles can adjust for the City's crosswalk ordinance. She urged the City Administrator to follow-up on this issue.

COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand congratulated the Third Ward's Allen Elementary on their award as a Blue Ribbon School.

Peter Eckstein, resident, addressed the recent suicides that have occurred on the City's parking structures. He urged Council to cut the red tape and take action to secure the parking structures with physical barriers to help restrict opportunities for suicide.

Barry Powers, Cranbrook Law Group, spoke about the City's deer cull. He spoke in opposition and suggested that Council is not authorized to manage wildlife under the Michigan State Constitution.

Edward Vielmetti, Fourth Ward, spoke about the DDA's procurement process. He urged Council to oversee the process and ensure an open process.

Kai Petainen, resident, spoke in support of the Broadway Village development. He also addressed the City's problem with suicide and urged the City to partner with the University of Michigan.

Kathy Griswold, Second Ward, spoke about economic development and "right sizing." She also spoke about supply and demand and opportunity cost.
