Having the firms on retainer allows projects in the department to move faster due to already having engineers to consult rather than searching out a firm for each project.

Whereas, Award of contracts for services on an as-needed basis will allow the City to expedite the design, engineering and construction of improvements in the Parks & Recreation system;

Whereas, Funding is available in the approved FY2018 Parks Maintenance and Capital Improvements budget to cover the cost of these services; and

Whereas, Funding for services in FY 2019 and FY 2020 will be contingent upon City Council approval of the Parks Maintenance and Capital Improvements budget;

RESOLVED, That the Park Advisory Commission recommend City Council approve three-year Professional Services Agreements for Architecture Services with SmithGroupJJR, Inc. and ROWE Professional Services Company for a Not to Exceed Annual Amount of \$150,000.00 per PSA.

Mitchell and Mouat Architects Kohler Architects

Whereas, Award of contracts for services on an as-needed basis will allow the City to expedite the architectural design and construction of improvements in the Parks & Recreation system;

Whereas, Funding is available in the approved FY2018 Parks Maintenance and Capital Improvements budget to cover the cost of these services; and

Whereas, Funding for services in FY 2019 and FY 2020 will be contingent upon City Council approval of the Parks Maintenance and Capital Improvements budget;

RESOLVED, That the Park Advisory Commission recommend City Council approve three-year Professional Services Agreements for Architecture Services with Mitchell and Mouat Architects and Kohler Architects for a Not to Exceed Annual Amount of \$150,000.00 per PSA.

G4 <u>17-1503</u> Resolution to Recommend Approval of a Contract with Cross Renovations, Inc. to Construct an Addition at Bryant Community Center (\$315,750.00)

H. Hanzel gave a brief explanation of the various improvements that will be made to the Bryant Community Center if the contract with Cross Renovations, Inc. is approved.

Approve resolution reads as follows:

Whereas, the Parks and Recreation Open Space Plan identifies construction of an addition to the Bryant Community Center as a priority project;

Whereas, City staff held public meetings and worked with staff from CAN to identify project needs; Whereas, The project supports multiple City sustainability goals;

Whereas, Funding for construction is available in the approved FY2018 Park Maintenance and Capital Improvement Millage budget (\$135,000.00) and through a grant from OCED (\$210,000);

Whereas, Competitive bids were received by Purchasing on April 11, 2017 to construct the addition and renovate the existing structure;

Whereas, The Park Advisory Commission recommended approval of this contract at their September 19, 2017 meeting;

Whereas, Cross Renovations, Inc. submitted the lowest responsive bid;

RESOLVED, That the Park Advisory Commission recommend City Council approve a contract with Cross Renovations, Inc. in the amount of \$315,750.00 and approve a construction contingency of \$29,250.00 to cover potential contract change orders for a total contract amount of \$345,000.00 for the life of the project without regard to fiscal year.

A motion was made by Jackson and seconded by Kraut that the Resolution be Approved.

Approved unanimously.
