Staff has completed the revision to the City's **Green Fleet Policy.** The revised document will be sent to the Energy Commission and Environmental Commission for review and input.

Other

Seasonal Compost Pickup. The seasonal curbside pickups of compostable materials will end for the growing season on Friday, Dec. 8, 2017. Ann Arbor's compost collection provides an opportunity for pickup of fall leaves and other yard debris that have been placed on lawn extensions in paper bags or compost carts or tied into brush bundles, as described online at <u>a2gov.org/compost</u>.

Sign Ordinance Updates. The City of Ann Arbor is updating its sign ordinance to include new and innovative sign standards that reflect evolving technologies and approaches as well as a general update of sign regulations. Two public meeting have been held seeking public feedback. A third public meeting is scheduled on Wednesday, Dec. 13 from 9 – 10 a.m. at the DDA, 150 S. Fifth, Ann Arbor, MI. The project consultant Giffels Webster, has set up an online feedback platform called <u>PictureThis™</u> to better understand how residents and business owners think the current sign ordinance is working and what may need work. As they are out and about in Ann Arbor, the city urges the public to look for the signs they view as particularly effective and attractive — or conversely — ineffective. Images can be submitted to <u>PictureThis™</u> from any internet browser via phone, tablet or computer by clicking the blue "what do you think?" button once on the PictureThis™ site.

City of Ann Arbor Citizens Academy. With the success of the Ann Arbor Citizens Police, Fire, and Courts Academy, the City of Arbor will launch an Ann Arbor Citizens Academy (A2CA) this spring to provide a broader view of local government for Ann Arbor residents.

During a series of six weekly sessions, from March 28 to May 2, 6:30–8:30 p.m., participants will connect with city staff and elected officials and learn more about long-term city planning efforts, day-to-day operations and the importance of civic involvement.
