COUNCILMEMBER BANNISTER

Councilmember Bannister also thanked Mary Fales for her service.

Councilmember Bannister updated Council on the February 9 Housing and Human Services Advisory Board meeting. She stated the HHSAB would be forwarding a resolution to Council regarding their recommendations for the expenditure of the City's mental health millage refund money.

Councilmember Bannister stated Ward 1 is hosting a meeting of the Poor People's Campaign at Arrowwood Hills Community Center, on Wednesday, February 21 from 6-8 p.m. All are welcome, she stated.

COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMAN

Councilmember Ackerman also spoke about the HHSAB's recommendation regarding the City's refund from the County millage. He noted that many federal programs, including Section 8 housing vouchers, are likely going to suffer from federal cuts and additional sources of funding would be needed.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm spoke about the City's medical marijuana permit process. She stated some 2nd Ward residents received a postcard regarding a Special Exception Use application and there are concerns from residents about new facilities. She stated she would like to propose an ordinance change to allow more public participation in the process.
