PUBLIC HOUSING

Project Idea: Tree pruning and removal at public housing sites throughout the City.

1. HIKONE MANOR - Hikone Road

Work Activities:

- Prune 20 trees along parking lot and on property (Honeylocusts and London Planetrees).
- Remove invasive trees that are leaning along fence line

Estimated Project Budget: \$5,000.00

2. BAKER COMMONS - S Main Street & Packard

Work Activities:

- Pruning street trees along S. Main St.
- Removing a few invasive trees and some shrubs on property along S. Main St.
- Clean up along the edges of the parking lot
- Remove dying crabapple by picnic table

Estimated Project Budget: \$1,000.00

3. MAPLE MEADOWS - Maple Rd.

Work Activities:

- Raise trees along driveway
- Prune small trees north of driveway and in courtyard

Estimated Project Budget: \$1,000.00

DEAN PROMENADE & N. MAIN STREET

Project Idea: Pruning trees in Dean Promenade and N. Main St.

Work Activities:

Prune all trees on Main Street form William to Catherine (~100 trees)

Estimated Project Budget: \$12,000.00

VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PARK

Project Idea: Street tree planting along Maple Road and Jackson Ave fronting Veteran's Memorial Park

Work Activities:

- Option 1: Remove all crabapples along both Maple and Jackson Ave and replant with large species where no overhead utilities exist.
 - o Remove 50 trees
 - Replant 35 trees (20 large trees along Maple Road and 15 small trees along Jackson Ave.)
 - Post planting care (watering and mulching) for 2 years

Estimated Project Budget:

Tree Removal and Planting: \$18,000

Post-planting care 2 years: \$7,000.00 (\$3,500/year)

(\$5/watering x 40 waterings) x 35 trees)

- Option 2: Remove dead/dying old crabapples along Maple Road and all trees along Jackson Ave and replant with large species where no overhead utilities exist.
 - o Remove 29 trees
 - Replant 25 trees (10 large trees along Maple Road and 15 small trees along Jackson Ave.)
 - Post Planting care (watering and mulching) for 2 years

Estimated Project Budget:

Tree Removal and Planting: \$14,000

Post-planting care 2 years: \$5,000.00 (\$2,500/year)

(\$5/watering x 40 waterings) x 25 trees)

S. MAIN STREET (NORTH OF EISENHOWER TO LAKE VILLAGE APARTMENT ENTRANCE)

Project Idea (staff): Tree Pruning small trees

Work Activities: Training and clearance trimming of Oak and London Planetrees from

Estimated Project Budget: \$4,000

HURON PARKWAY MEDIAN - North of Geddes and across from Huron High School

Project Idea: Tree planting in median

Work Activities: Plant 8-10 trees and 2 years of post-planting care.

Note: Staff will need to coordinate with City Traffic Engineers for placement

Estimated Project Budget:

Tree Planting: \$3,000

Post-planting care 2 years: \$2,000.00 (\$1,000/year)

(\$5/watering x 40 waterings) x 10 trees)

S STATE TREE MEDIAN - South of Eisenhower

Project Idea: Plant trees in median

Note: City is discussing redesigning this corridor – tree planting at this time would not be advisable. Staff can clean-up island by removing 2 dead trees and pruning remaining tree.

Estimated Project Budget: \$500

ARGO CANOE LIVERY

Project Idea: Reduce the soil compaction and improve the growing conditions of the English oaks growing between the pavilion and canoe livery building.

Work Activities: Vertical mulching (or similar root compaction reducing technique) and application of 3-4" of double shredded hardwood mulch in the root zones of the trees after vertical mulching is complete/

Estimated Project Budget: TBD (currently seeking quotes)

PIONEER HIGH SCHOOL FRONTAGE

Project Idea: Plant trees along Pioneer High School frontage

Note: Staff will need to look into, in previous conversations with AAPS they did not want street trees planted.
