The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider The Detroit Edison Company's (Detroit Edison) application to be filed by March 4, 2009 for approval to (1) implement a Renewable Energy Plan, and (2) implement an Energy Optimization Plan. The company also seeks related accounting and regulatory approvals.

Detroit Edison is seeking authority to recover additional annual levelized incremental costs of compliance associated with its Renewable Energy Plan through implementation of a maximum levelized monthly renewable energy surcharge of \$3.00 per meter for residential customers, \$16.58 per meter for commercial secondary customers, \$187.50 per meter for commercial primary and industrial customers, 4% of the total bill for residential unmetered customers, and 4% of the total bill for commercial secondary and governmental unmetered customers during the 20-

year renewable energy plan period. Detroit Edison is also seeking approval of a renewable energy plan for the 20-year period beginning September 1, 2009 and other related accounting and regulatory approvals.

In addition, Detroit Edison is seeking approval of an Energy Optimization Plan for the period beginning June 2009 and ending December 31, 2011. The company proposes to recover additional annual Energy Optimization Plan cost recovery in the amount up to \$35 million in 2009, \$45 million in 2010 and \$68 million in 2011 through implementation of maximum energy optimization surcharges, and other related accounting and regulatory approvals.

All documents filed in this case shall be submitted electronically through the Commission's E-Dockets Website at: michigan.gov/mpscedockets. Any person wishing to intervene and become a party to the case shall electronically file a petition to intervene with this Commission by March 9, 2009. Any person wishing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of his/her wish to make a statement of position. All information submitted to the Commission in this matter will become public information: available on the Michigan Public Service Commission's Web site, and subject to disclosure.
