I understand Mayor Taylor's desire to develop more housing in Ann Arbor, but I haven't actually seen it achieve the goal of making rental prices more competitive and hence lower. In fact, it just seems to be bringing in more people who are willing to pay the high prices.

More developments like this are increasing the population density and making the traffic worse and, consequently, the roads (already in terrible condition) are getting worse.
