### Safety Notes

**A2** Be Safe! Winter Driving Safety. Like it or not, winter will soon be staring us right in the face. With the snowy and cold weather on its way, we also face the added headache of navigating our roads under wintry conditions. Obviously, driving in winter conditions requires some additional preparation and some added awareness of yourself, your vehicle, and all that is going on around you. The following are some winter driving tips to help avoid a disastrous winter driving season.

- Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage.
- Make certain your tires are properly inflated.
- Keep your gas tank at least half-full to avoid gas line freeze-up.
- Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface (wet, ice, sand).
- Use your seat belt every time you get into your vehicle.
- Accelerate and decelerate slowly.
- Drive slowly. Everything takes longer on snow-covered roads. Give yourself time to maneuver by driving slowly.
- The normal dry pavement following distance of three to four seconds should be increased to eight to ten seconds. This increased margin of safety will provide the longer distance needed if you have to stop.
- If you don't have somewhere you have to be, watch the snow from indoors.

#### Council Priorities/Initiatives

**Budget Priorities Online Community Survey.** On Sept. 4, City Council approved engaging the professional services of The Center for Priority Based Budgeting (CPBB) to conduct a Priority Based Budgeting Survey for the City of Ann Arbor. The goal of the community survey will be to obtain meaningful and broad citizen input to assist staff and City Council members in developing the city's budget and spending priorities for fiscal years 2020 and 2021.

In accordance with City Charter, the City Administrator's recommended fiscal year 2020 budget will be submitted to City Council on April 15, 2019. Fiscal year 2020 runs from July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020. City Council members can only adopt one fiscal year at a time even though the city plans for multi-year budgets.

The city encourages all residents to share their insights and opinions through this survey on what they believe the city's priorities should be for the upcoming budget. The deadline to take this <u>online-only survey</u> is Nov. 18, 2018. Results of the survey will be provided to City Council members in early December and made available to the public via the city's website.

**Annual Council Planning Session December 10**. Council's annual budget planning retreat is scheduled for Mon., December 10 at the Ann Arbor District Library downtown branch from 4:00 to 9:00 p.m

#### Previews

The **November 8 Council Meeting** will feature the following items of interest:

Public Hearings and Second Readings (3)

- At second reading An Ordinance to Amend Section 9:38 and 9:42 of Chapter 107 (Animals) of the Code of the City of Ann Arbor Regarding the Addition of Ducks to the Referenced Sections (Ordinance No. ORD-18-31). These changes add ducks as allowable domesticated animals and fowl under City ordnance.
- A Resolution to Approve Midtown Ann Arbor Condominium Site Plan and Development Agreement, 1420 South Maple Road (CPC Recommendation: Approval - 6 Yeas and 0 Nays). The property at 1420 South Maple Road provides for the construction 256 dwelling units and 600 bedrooms in 17 buildings. The attached development agreement also requires the dedication of 1.06 acres for a public park and a contribution of \$107,000 to the Parks and Recreation Unit.
- A Resolution to Approve 132 Hill Street Site Plan (CPC Recommendation: Approval 8 Yeas and 0
  Nays). The site plan proposes demolishing the existing 4,200 SF home and constructing a new 11,653
  SF five-unit apartment building.

**Thank you Veterans!** City Veterans Day Schedule for November 12. Ann Arbor municipal offices, including the customer service center at Larcom City Hall and the 15th Judicial District Court, will be closed for the observation of Veterans Day on Monday, Nov. 12, 2018. However, the city's normal trash, compost and recycling curbside service will be provided without interruption. Safety services and utility operations will maintain 24-hour schedules throughout.

Also to observe the holiday, Ann Arbor Parks and Recreation will say thank you to military veterans with special offerings at four locations on Veterans Day, Sunday, Nov. 11.

- Mack Indoor Pool will offer free swimming to military veterans during lap swim time, 10 a.m.–1 p.m., and also during open swim, 1–6 p.m. The pool is located at 715 Brooks St., inside Ann Arbor Open School.
- Veterans Memorial Park Indoor Ice Arena (2150 Jackson Ave.) and Buhr Park Outdoor Ice Arena (2751 Packard Road) will offer free ice skating and skate rental for military veterans. Vets Park open skate times are 1–2:30 p.m.; and open skating at Buhr is 2:30–4:30 p.m. and 7:15–8:45 p.m.
- Military veterans can play nine or 18 holes at <u>Huron Hills Golf Course</u> (3465 E. Huron River Drive) free of charge on Sunday, Nov. 11. Power cart rental is \$5 for nine holes, \$10 for 18 holes.
