- <u>E-Scooters as a Public Heath Concern</u> Electric scooter use results in 20 injuries per 100,000 trips, CDC finds.
- <u>City Transportation Rankings</u> City rankings based on bike ridership, safety/traffic injuries, transportation network connectivity, public reach, and "acceleration" (speed of improvement). Ann Arbor ranks 24th in the nation based on its overall score, and 8th in safety.
