- 1. Vet's Park potential Soldier Row: Hillary Hanzel is creating a Landscape Plan, which will include species recommendations. Focus will be on planting native large shade trees.
  - a. **Project timeline:**



**Existing Conditions**: This area was planted with crabapples. As they've declined, they've been replaced with crabapples.





2. Dean Promenade/Main Street (in front of Shinola & Kilwin's): There is one planter area not planted. The stump remains as there is fiber running directly beneath the stump. To excavate this pit and remove the stump, hydro-spading would be needed to expose all the roots and the fiber line so the stump can be removed without damage to the cable. The pit could then be refilled and replanted. Matt Waldsmith is working to pull together estimated costs to perform this work. He will bring the funding request
