

Dear Ms. Briere,

I'm one of the persons (along with Joe O'Neal, David Barrett, and Jonathan Bulkeley) who has been meeting with members of City Council to discuss issues surrounding the proposal to remove Argo Dam. David Barrett informed me that you were concerned about possible consequences of dam removal vis a vis the MichCon service center which is located in the middle of the Huron River flood plain below the dam.

Your concerns are well placed! Lost and not yet addressed in the controversy about removing Argo Dam is the question of "Where Will the River Flow if the Dam is Removed"? Instead of continuing in a southerly direction the Huron River today turns sharply northward below Argo Dam (see overhead photo below).



This is not a natural or normal way for a river to flow. The abrupt, "fish hook" bend was not always present. Historical maps (dated 1895 and 1943) show that the river channel at one time roughly paralleled the AMTRAK railway... and passed under the present location of the MichCon service center.

Sometime between 1895 and 1943 the Huron River changed its course or was deflected northward into the channel it now occupies. This deflection was made possible in part because of the presence of Argo Dam which dissipates some of the energy and momentum of the river flow in a plunge pool and stilling basin at the base of the dam.

If the dam is removed the river will attempt to re-occupy its old channel. This would result in flooding and inundation of the MichCon service center and surrounding areas. A coal gasification plant was located there earlier, and toxic residues are buried in the ground. River training measures, e.g., bendway weirs, vanes, and/or groins, will be required to confine the river to its present channel and prevent this from happening.

If you are interested, I can send you a brief written report in the mail that provides additional information, maps, and photographs illustrating this dilemma. The report uses too much storage capacity (because of its graphics) to attach to this E-mail

I've shown these photographs/maps to and discussed the situation with David Derrick who is a hydraulic engineer with the US Corps of Engineers, Engineering Research and Development Center. He is one of the foremost authorities in the US on streambank protection and river training measures. David has designed and supervised the construction of these protective measures on small and large rivers.

### He noted the following:

- 1) It will be challenging to keep the Huron River out of its old channel if the dam is removed, Robust (and costly) river training and bank protection structures would be needed
- 2 Hydraulic modeling studies, e.g., HEC-RAs are required to assess post dam removal flow conditions and to select and design necessary training measures.

These studies have NOT been undertaken nor construction costs determined. These investigations should precede any serious proposal to remove Argo Dam. It simply does not make any sense to spend huge amounts of money to remove Argo Dam only to turn around and spend an equivalent amount of money constructing river training structures to keep the river in its present channel (and out of the MichCon service center) if the dam is removed.

I would welcome the opportunity to discuss these considerations with you further. Thank you for your interest in this important issue.


