

Unfortunately, I will not be able to continue on the Human Rights Commission due to conflicts with MDCR, and am issuing my resignation, effective immediately. I sincerely hope that the remaining commissioners and council liaisons see through efforts to ban conversion therapy, and to amend the nondiscrimination ordinance to better protect tenants utilizing housing subsidies. In addition, my resignation is another opportunity for Mayor Taylor to reappoint Vivian to the HRC. I won't belabor the issue as I think the resolution we passed speaks for itself.

Overall, I have truly enjoyed meeting and working with all of you, and I thank each of you for your commitment to this important work.



All,

I am reaching out to make sure that HRC members are aware of life changes that impact my ability to continue doing commission work. As some of you are aware, I have accepted an offer to join the Michigan Department of Civil Rights where I will be doing nondiscrimination work at the state level. I was advised that I could not continue my work with ICPOC and resigned with the below email a little over a week ago. As I was not yet deeply involved in any work on ICPOC, I thought it best to distance myself sooner than later. Although I plan to remain on the HRC as long as possible, it is my understanding that my role as a Human Rights Commissioner may be an insurmountable conflict, as well. If that is the case, I will be issuing my resignation from the HRC prior to July 1st when I start work for MDCR. I will be sure to keep everyone posted once a final determination is made.
