Presentation of the American Planning Association's "Great Places in America Award" for South Main Street

Wendy Rampson, Interim Planning and Development Services Manager, addressed Council regarding the American Planning Association's "Great Places in America Award" for South Main Street. The APA designated South Main Street as one of 10 Great Streets for 2009. The APA recognizes unique and authentic characteristics found in the essential components of all communities, streets, neighborhoods and public spaces. APA Great Places recipients offer better choices for where and how people work and live everyday, places that are enjoyable, safe and desirable. South Main Street, which was part of Ann Arbor's original city plat in 1824, has always been integral to the City's Central Business District. Today the street is the center of Ann Arbor's civic activities and community gatherings as well as a demonstration area for more sustainable development practices.
